### **51/04 Apologies**

### **52/04 Late Items Introduced by the Chair**

### **53/04 Declarations of Interest**

### **54/04 Application for an Occasional Public Entertainment Licence – The Gatehouse, 5 Friar Gate, Derby**

A report of the Director of Corporate Services was considered which gave details of an application for an Occasional Public Entertainment Licence, to extend the opening hours on the night of Saturday 6 November from 4.00am to 6.00am, for the Gatehouse, 5 Friar Gate, Derby. Mr Greg Dufton – the applicant attended the meeting and addressed the Sub Committee.

It was noted that there were no objections from Environmental Heath and Trading Standards, Derbyshire Fire and Rescue Service, Police Authority or Development and Cultural Services. Reservations had been received from Pollution Control in relation to noise levels. Officers had visited the premises and discussed their concerns with the applicant. The applicant had agreed to carry out all necessary work within a period of 4 weeks.

Objections had been received from residents of Cavendish Court, Willow Row in respect of noise levels. Joan Lonnon and John Nicholson – residents of Cavendish Court and Steven Ward – representative from Derwent Living, attended the meeting and addressed the Sub Committee.

**Resolved to grant the application for an Occasional Public  
Entertainment Licence on 6 November 2004, subject to a reduction of  
the closing time from 6.00am to 5.00am.**

**The Committee also sought and obtained an undertaking from the applicant to upgrade the fire doors, as he had indicated, by 3 December 2004.**

**Finally the Sub Committee recommended that the applicant meets with representatives of the residents association to discuss the effectiveness of the ongoing noise reduction initiatives.**
