# 86/04 Revenue Budget Monitoring 2004/5 and Budget Planning update

- 6. To approve the initial programme of corporate efficiency saving reviews as set out in Appendix 4, subject to receipt of a further report back to Cabinet following further consultation.

#### 95/04 Food Law Enforcement Plan 2004 /2005

The Council Cabinet considered a report from the Planning and Environment Commission on the Food Law Enforcement Plan 2004/2005. The Commission had no specific comments on the content of the plan and suggested that the Council Cabinet give consideration to making available the resources that the Environmental Health and Trading Standards Division would need to maintain the level of Food Standards and Food Safety Inspections that it had achieved in 2003/04.

#### **Decision**

- 1. To recommend Council to approve the Food Law Enforcement Plan 2004/05 as part of the Budget and Policy Framework.
- 2. To examine resource levels in the 2005/06 budget process.

## **Key Decisions**

## 106/04 Creative Industries Managed Workspace Finance Proposal

The Council Cabinet considered a joint report from the Directors of Finance and Development and Cultural Services, setting out the benefits of creative industries managed workspace projects, which were recognised nationally, regionally and locally, as a growth sector which could bring jobs, investment and training to urban economies. The development of the creative industries in Derby would enable the local economy to diversify and enhance other strong, established sectors such as high technology engineering. A number of sites were identified to be developed using the creative industries funding and the

report included those which were suitable as well as those which were deemed to be unsuitable.

#### **Options considered**

The following site options were considered and found unsuitable:

- Johal Mills, Monk Street. Unsuitable as owners wished to retain ownership, refurbishment costs were higher than new build and the site fell outside the Cityscape and SDO area.
- St Werburgh's Cloisters. Unsuitable as heritage issues restricted the internal density to less that the minimum for economic viability.
- Old Fire Station, Bold Lane. Unsuitable as building was too small and the costs of relocating the Museum stores would prove prohibitive.
- Green Lane Building. Unsuitable as the location was poor and the costs of refurbishment would prove prohibitive.
- Joint development with QUAD. Unsuitable as the combined project would be too large for Quad's sensitive, high profile site.
- Markeaton Craft Village. Unsuitable as the site was outside both the SDO and Cityscape boundaries, and the buildings were too small.
- Darley Abbey Mills. Unsuitable as the site is outside the SDO and Cityscape boundary.

#### **Decision**

- To approve the appropriation of land forming part of the old Ford Street Nursery site from Social Services to Development and Cultural Services for the development of the Creative Industries Workspace.
- 2. To approve the construction of a Creative Industries Managed Workspace on the Ford Street Nursery site, subject to confirmation of funding from external partners.
- 3. To recommend Council to approve additional unsupported borrowing of £620,000 to fund part of the construction costs, conditional upon the viability of the scheme being confirmed by the Director of Finance upon the outcome of a further financial appraisal by a corporate officer panel.
- 4. To authorise officers to enter into negotiations to purchase the adjacent site with the current owner to facilitate the development of the Creative Industries Managed Workspace.
- 5. To recommend Council to approve the associated changes to the Council's approved prudential indicators to reflect the necessary revisions to the

- capital programme and unsupported borrowing, subject to further detailed confirmation when these indicators were next updated.
- 6. To establish appropriate internal controllable recharges between Development and Cultural Services and Corporate budgets to ensure that corporate costs were directly offset against associated financial savings.

#### Reasons

- 1. The project had to move forward rapidly to meet the requirements from the funding partners.
- 2. The income generated from rental receipts from the building would support the borrowing.
- 3. Regeneration partners require a Council contribution to the project to release funds.
- 4. To assemble the land on which to construct the complete workspace scheme.
- 5. As the unsupported borrowing is not in the Capital Programme, the constitution requires that the decision be made by full Council.
