# **Neighbourhoods Directorate Fees and Charges 2015/16**

# SUMMARY

- 1.1 The NeighbourhoodsDirectorate annually reviews its fees and charges across its range of services. This is to ensure thatthe fees and charges where applicablereflect the cost of delivering services, take into account comparator rates for these services within the sector, ensure that inflationary cost increases are taken into account, and that budget income targets are achieved.
- 1.2 The proposed fees and charges for Leisure and Culture for 2015/16are set out in Appendix2. The service areas within the department that are included in the proposals are libraries, leisure centres, parks and golfwhere the Council has discretion to set the fees. The inflationary increase that has been specified by the Council on the 2014/15fees and chargeshas been applied unless otherwise stated.
- 1.3 All prices are shown inclusive of VAT where it is applicable.

2.1 To approve the fees and chargesfor 2015/16as set out in Appendix2.

# **REASONSFOR RECOMMENDATION**

3.1 To enable the Leisure and Culture Department within the NeighbourhoodsDirectorate to implement new fees and charges, as applicable from 1 April 2015.

- Fees and charges reflect the cost of delivering the service and/or charging levels for that sector
- 4.2 The proposed fees and charges for 2015/16for the Leisure and Culture Department are setout in Appendix 2 where the Council has the discretion to set fees and charges.
- 4.3 The proposals for pricing for 2015-16 include the percentage recommendation from finance regarding the inflationary increase unless otherwise noted in the report.
