SUSPENSION NOTICES

Since 25 April 2012, the Authority has been able to serve a suspension notice on those who hold a licence under the Licensing Act 2003, who have not paid their annual fees.

23 suspension notices were issued during the period. The total outstanding was £3940.

21 paid realising £3325. Of the remaining 3, 1 licence was found to have lapsed, 2 suspensions remain in place, but are not currently trading.

INSPECTIONS

16 licensing inspections have been conducted during this period.
