GAMBLING ACT - FINAL DRAFT STATEMENT OF PRINCIPLES

RECOMMENDATION

- 1.1 To approve the recommendations of the Cross Party Working Group.
- 1.2 To recommend to Council to adopt the final draft version of the Gambling Act Statement of Principles.
- 1.3 To note the comments and information obtained from the consultation process.

SUPPORTING INFORMATION

- 2.1 At its meeting on 26 July 2006, Committee noted a draft Gambling Act Statement of Principles. This draft statement has been the subject of a wide consultation exercise over the summer. Approximately 290 consultation packs and 700 mailshots were sent out during the consultation period.
- 2.2 Members also resolved to establish a cross party working group to consider comments received from the consultation exercise. The cross party working group met on 4 October 2006 to consider the comments that had been received and the officer's recommendations about those comments. This information is contained at Appendix 2.
- 2.3 A number of the comments made have been incorporated into the statement. Some of the other comments made fell outside the scope of the statement or went substantially beyond what the Council is permitted to do under the legislation and statutory guidance.
- 2.4 The recommendations of the cross party working group have been incorporated into the final draft version of the Council's Gambling Act Statement of Principles. This is attached at Appendix 3.

- 2.1 The Gambling Act 2005 requires the Council to prepare and publish a statement of principles every three years. The statement must be published before the Council carries out any function in respect of any applications made under the terms of the Act.
- 2.2 Before determining its statement for any three-year period, the Council must carry out a statutory consultation process.
