

## **Anti Social Behaviour in Normanton Topic Review Update**

### **SUMMARY**

- 1.1 At its first meeting of the municipal year, members expressed a desire to look in more detail at issues relating to anti-social behaviour in the city. A scoping report was agreed by members and stage one of the topic review was completed and presented to the Board.
- 1.2 At the last meeting of the Neighbourhoods Board on 12 March 2013, a revised scoping report set out a proposal on how stage two of the topic review could be carried out, and members agreed to proceed with the proposed methodology.
- 1.3 The purpose of this report is to enable an update on progress of the topic review to board members, and to allow for any comments and suggestions to be made.

### **RECOMMENDATION**

- 2.1 To note the topic review update and make any comments or recommendations.

### **REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATION**

- 3.1 To ensure that the Board is kept informed on progress with regards to the Anti-Social Behaviour topic review.

### **SUPPORTING INFORMATION**

- 4.1 At its first meeting of the municipal year, the Neighbourhoods Board agreed to consider how anti-social behaviour in the Normanton area could be tackled and see what lessons could be learnt for other parts of the City.
- 4.2 At the September meeting of the Neighbourhoods Board, members agreed the scope and timescales for the Anti Social Behaviour in Normanton topic review. The scoping report for this review identified that stage one of the review would involve the development of a 'problem profile' of the review area through the collation of data from various sources and partner organisations.

- 4.3 At the meeting of 06 November 2012, the Overview and Scrutiny Officer updated the Board on progress made with stage one of the topic review, and the Head of Communities and Partnerships presented the results of the 'problem profile' of the area to the Board. The Board agreed at this stage to proceed to stage two of the review.
- 4.4 Following on from the development of the draft Strategic Intelligence Assessment, which identified a set of priorities for the city, and the development of the Derbyshire Police and Crime Plan 2012-2017, the Chair of the Neighbourhoods Overview and Scrutiny Board, Head of Partnerships and Communities and the Overview and Scrutiny Officer agreed that 'stage two' of the 'Antisocial behaviour in Normanton' topic review needed to be more focused and innovative in order to achieve deliverable outcomes.
- 4.5 A revised methodology for stage two of the review was developed and presented to the Board at its meeting of 12 March 2012. The Board resolved to agree that the Overview and Scrutiny Officer, together with the Head of Partnerships and Communities continue with the Anti Social Behaviour Topic Review as proposed and report progress to the next meeting of the Neighbourhoods Overview and Scrutiny Board.
