George Rennie City Heritage Award 2022

Purpose

- 1.1 To discuss and agree whether The George Rennie Award should be arranged, projects nominated and agreed over future meetings for the year 2022 by Conservation and Heritage Advisory Committee Members.

This usual annual award is made by the Conservation and Heritage Advisory Committee in memory of the services of a former long standing Conservation Officer for the city, George Rennie. The Conservation and Heritage Advisory Committee make the awards in recognition of the care and skill taken in conservation projects and high-quality new build projects within conservation areas completed in the calendar year of 12 months.

 - In 2020 the Silk Mill Museum of Making – Winner
Green Lane House (former Quicksilver) – Highly Commended
 - In 2021 Market Hall Roof – phase 1 – Winner
Bridge Chapel roof repairs – Highly Commended

- 4.2 At the last meeting The Standing Order was nominated for proposals which included the refurbishment and extension into adjacent listed building 33-34 Iron Gate. Also nominated were the refurbishment of the locally listed pepper pot towers on the former DRI site. No other nominations have been received.
