It's great that the gap in the DfE's policy is being filled and we are grateful that academies are being included. As requested, schools in our trust will be in touch to give feedback on how the money was spent in due course.”

“...we used the IT funding for KS1 pupils to go towards purchasing 18 tablets. Tablets were chosen instead of laptops as we felt the children would be able to use them more independently at that age, and is a piece of IT equipment that many of them would be familiar with. Our grant was for £1,461.99, with a total of £2,397.60 being spent on the tablets altogether.”





Business manager

“We are very grateful for the KS1 PP digital devices grant. Our order was made some time ago and we are expecting the devices soon. We have invested in 6 iPads (2 for each KS1 class) along with a charging cabinet, safety cases and headphones. The devices will be used daily in the classrooms and we can allow children to use take them home. We have a core digital offer of Phonics Heros, Collins eBooks, Numbots and Education City. Each is monitored by class teachers and children can only access content at their level. We are currently running a Numbots after school club which targets KS1 PP children and is a great maths intervention.”



“I can confirm we have purchased 4 x iPads and cases for use by disadvantaged children in KS1.

SEND support for disadvantaged

- ▶ Initial plan to commission PCT to deliver 50k of equipment and associated software and accessories but lack of capacity has changed that
- ▶ The council is now directing the funding to pupils in NC years 3-6 for KS2 we have Furthermore this will target 631 CYP with plans funded by Derby
- ▶ They are attending 87 schools in mostly small numbers apart from St. Giles (90), Brackensdale Spencer Academy (36) and Springfield Primary (34).
- ▶ Based on the last school census 42.8% of pupils with EHCPs were eligible for FSM so that would be 270 pupils eligible for the SEND disadvantaged funding
- ▶ Schools will confirm the numbers and we will issue the funding
- ▶ Schools will report back on how the funds have been spent (pupils to own the equipment not the school).
