Moved by Councillor Shanker, seconded by Councillor Peatfield:

Council recognises the contribution of Dame Margaret Beckett to the City of Derby, having served as the Member of Parliament for the Derby South constituency for more than 40 years.

During that time Dame Margaret has served her constituents with diligence and tenacity, championing Derby's manufacturing industries on the national stage and steadfastly maintaining her commitment to hosting regular advice surgeries for the people of our city.

In her long and distinguished Parliamentary career, Dame Margaret has served as a Minister in four Labour Governments and in 1994 became the first woman to lead the Labour Party. In 2006, she was appointed as the first female Foreign Secretary and only the second woman to hold one of the Great Offices of State. Council thanks Dame Margaret for her service to the nation and is proud of her record as a trailblazer for women's representation.

Council notes Dame Margaret's intention to stand down from Parliament at the next General Election and wishes her a long and healthy retirement. In recognition of her contribution to Derby and to the United Kingdom, Council resolves to award Freedom of the City to the Rt Hon

Dame Margaret Beckett MP at a specially convened meeting, to be arranged in due course.
