Report of the Chair of Regeneration and Culture Board

Vibrant City Strategy

SUMMARY

1.1 The Regeneration and Culture Board considered, at their 21 October 2014 meeting, reports from the Cabinet Member for Regeneration and the Chief Executive, on the Vibrant City Strategy. The Cabinet report identifies six potential district centres for inclusion in the improvement programme.

RECOMMENDATION

2.1 To establish clear criteria of prioritisation for redevelopment of district centres and that this process is made more transparent.

REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATION

3.1 Derby has a number of district centres, each with its own unique characteristics. They all play an important role in meeting the social and economic needs of their local community. They also have their own sets of issues which require resolving. It is therefore important to establish criteria for selection of each district centre for regeneration. This will enable the Council to spend its scarce resources based on need in a fair and transparent manner and achieve best value for money. It will enable us to consider what 'good' looks like.

SUPPORTING INFORMATION

4.1 The Board welcomed the extension of the city centre strategy to include district centres in the regeneration improvement programme. District centres are recognised as making an important economic and social contribution to the wellbeing of the city and therefore also require regeneration. Having considered the report, the Board was unclear about the methodology used to select the district centres for the regeneration programme and sought greater clarification on this.
