Derby Safeguarding Children Board

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1 Introduction

This document provides an annual review of the activity of Derby's partnership arrangements to safeguard children and young people and sets out the key actions for the coming year.

This last year has been a time of significant scrutiny of these arrangements and the work of the Local Safeguarding Children Board. The Children's Trust arrangements were the subject of both the Annual Performance Assessment and Joint Area Review in 2007. Both concluded that the contribution of local services to improving outcomes for children and young people at risk or requiring safeguarding was good (3)

Many strengths were identified. These have been achieved through:

- the implementation of the new safeguarding procedures jointly with Derbyshire County Council;
- strengthening existing links with multi-agency public protection arrangements and the Domestic Violence Partnership;
- developing the work of the Stay Safe outcome group to promote well-being;
- providing awareness raising training for faith groups; and
- setting up a performance monitoring framework.

Just a few examples of the effective work noted in the APA/JAR were:

- children at risk are identified with responses appropriate and timely, both during and outside office hours;
- a good range of effective preventative services available and good quality training accessible to parents and staff from all agencies;
- success in involving children and young people in the planning, development and operation of services;
- the number of re-registrations of children subject of a child protection plan had continued to reduce with robust and effective review procedures ensuring that all cases are reviewed in accordance with the guidelines
- the timeliness of reviews of children in care has improved significantly from 68.5% to 84%, which is now above the statistical neighbour average;
- the timeliness of core assessments remains very good (Band 5 over 89%).

The areas identified for development were felt to be accurate and not a surprise to the partnership and are included in the actions for the Board and CYP plans for the forthcoming year. It was pleasing to see that the hard work by all staff throughout the agencies has been noted, setting a positive foundation for the considerable challenges ahead.

The purpose of this document is to set out:

- The arrangements of the Derby Safeguarding Children Board ("the Board")
- A review of the DSCB Business Plan 2007-2008
- The key priorities that the Board has identified for 2008-2009 and the action it will take to improve safeguarding arrangements and promote children's welfare
- The arrangements for monitoring progress and checking the quality of activity to effectively safeguard and promote the welfare of children.

It is the underpinning document for the work of the Board and the constituent partner agencies, through which we aim to strengthen even further our arrangements, practice and outcomes.

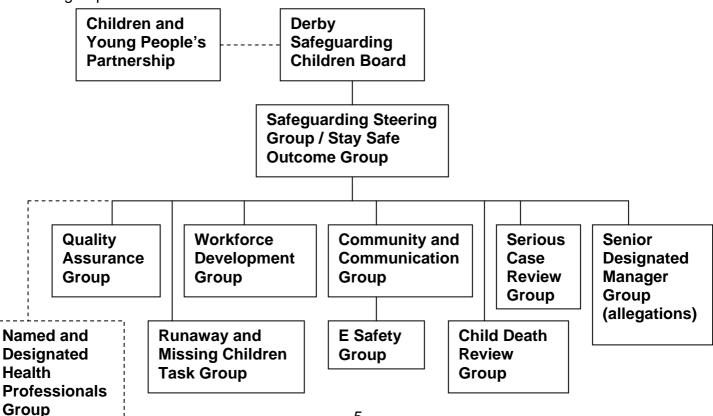

2 Role of the Derby Safeguarding Children Board

The remit of the Board is to:

- Provide leadership and make sure the relevant organisations in Derby cooperate to safeguard and promote the welfare of children in the area in such a way as to improve the five outcomes for children and young people;
- Monitor the effectiveness of the Business Plan:
- Ensure that safeguarding issues are raised in the wider community, and in the media, where appropriate;
- Ensure appropriate resources are available to carry out safeguarding functions;
- Ensure that there are robust, transparent and auditable governance arrangements dealing with the development of audit tools for assessing and promoting clinical quality across the Services;
- Audit and evaluate the effectiveness of local services in relation to safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children;
- Put into place performance measures to ensure that arrangements and standards for safeguarding children are in line with local and national requirements;
- Ensure appropriate consultation takes place with Service Users;
- Demonstrate and develop partnership working and promote cooperation between individual agencies and the Members of the Children and Young People's Partnership about the safeguarding children agenda;
- Share information and experience between all persons who have a seat on the Partnership Board;
- Provide induction for all new members of the board:
- Develop and maintain trust between all stake holders.

The local safeguarding children arrangements combine the work of an Executive Board, a Steering group (Stay Safe outcome group) and a number of working groups.

The Board's relationship with the Children and Young People's Partnership

The Board will make an annual report to the Partnership at an annual meeting to review the effectiveness of the Trust's arrangements to safeguard and promote the welfare of children in light of the previous business plan and to make sure the two groups do not duplicate work or leave strategic or operational gaps in policies, protocols, services or practice.

4 Safeguarding Steering Group / Stay Safe Outcome Group

The group meets on a bi-monthly basis. Its membership is drawn from all those agencies with a statutory duty to co-operate with local safeguarding arrangements and representatives of the voluntary sector. The group is well attended and very active. The remit of the group is to:

- Work alongside the Board on the development of a safeguarding strategy for Derby;
- Develop and execute the Business Plan;
- Participate in the planning of services for children by acting as the "staying safe" Outcome Group within the Derby Children and Young People's Partnership;
- Produce an Annual Report;
- Co-ordinate the work of other groups and ensure proper communication throughout the Board Structure;
- Promote the welfare agenda and ensure the five outcomes are addressed.
- Ensure that procedures and guidance are in place, and fit for purpose;
- Monitor performance and audit practice to continually improve safeguarding services;
- Manage the budget.

5 Named and Designated Health Professionals Group

The group meets on a bi-monthly basis. Its membership is the named and designated health professionals from the PCT, Foundation Trust and Ambulance Trust across Derby and Derbyshire.

The aim of the is to strengthen inter-professional working within health agencies on safeguarding children to meet local needs and national objectives and standards in line with Working Together to Safeguard Children 2006.

Named and Designated Health Professionals are members of the Steering Group and seek to provide consultation as necessary and a conduit for effective working between both groups.

WORKING GROUPS

6 Senior Designated Manager Group (allegations)

The group meets on a bi-monthly basis. Its membership is drawn from all those agencies with a statutory duty to co-operate with local safeguarding arrangements and representatives of the voluntary sector.

The remit of the group is to:

- Ensure safe arrangements are in place for managing allegations against staff, carers and volunteers
- Progress safe employment practices
- Develop a focus on safeguarding children in relation to employment of staff
- Manage safe systems in relation to ContactPoint
- Support the implementation of the Independent Safeguarding Authority

7 Runaway and Missing Children Task Group

Established in 2007, the Runaway and Missing Children Task Group works to ensure the development and implementation of a partnership approach to delivering the strategy for Runaway and Missing Children. The group reports to the Steering group and will produce an annual report.

The membership of the Task Group is:

- Police
- Safe and Sound
- Runaways
- C & YP Department Education Welfare
- C & YP Department Social Care / Children in Care
- Derby City Council Housing Options

8 Quality Assurance Group

The group meets on a bi monthly basis and there has been good multi agency sign up and attendance. The remit of the group is to:

- Ensure policies and procedures are up to date and available to all relevant staff.
- Ensure that safeguarding standards are in place.
- Undertake audit work as agreed by the Steering Group/Board.
- Respond to new legislation/regulations and guidance relevant to safeguarding children and promotion of welfare.
- Monitor on a multi agency basis the outcome framework and additional child protection performance against agreed indicators.
- Devise multi agency Children in Need procedures.
- Ensure implementation of new initiatives e.g. ISA, Common Assessment.
- Raise any shortfalls in practice with the Steering Group/Board.
- Address Public Health Issues.

The group has successfully monitored the effectiveness of the revised procedures via a practice audit of files, training and has carried out an annual review (jointly with Derbyshire LSCB) to ensure that updates added and implemented.

The procedures concerning the Child Death Review process have been implemented alongside arrangements for the Child Death Review Group (see below).

Core Group working has continued to be the focus of training and a review of the multi agency documentation used throughout the conference process leading to the implementation of new multi agency pro formas during 2008.

A conference on Female Genital Mutilation was deferred from February to June and launches the consultation of multi agency guidance.

Multi Agency Guidance in relation to Domestic Violence has been delayed as a result of personnel changes within the Community Safety Partnership and will be vigorously pursued during the forthcoming year.

Action plans from serious case reviews have been reviewed, alongside the National Biennial Review of serious case reviews (2001 – 2003 and 2003 – 2005 – DCSF) and the threshold project in Derby. These have informed the update of training, the Stay Safe Action Plan, the procedures and development of new training for managers.

Work has begun with a range of different Faith Groups establishing themselves in Derby or extending their services. The multi faith forum SACRE (Standing Advisory Council for Religious Education) were part of the extensive consultation on guidance for the Voluntary, Community and Faith based organisations to be published in 2008.

9 Workforce Development Group

The group meets on a three monthly basis and there has been a good multi agency sign up and attendance. The remit of the group is to:

- Produce a multi-agency training plan following regular audits of need.
- Implement training strategy.
- Quality assure the effectiveness of multi-agency training.
- Ensure single agency training provided is consistent with requirements around Safeguarding Children.
- Respond to ad-hoc training requests.
- Provide training in line with new legislation and guidance.
- Provide publicity around training to be held
- Manage training budget.

The workforce development group has supported the successful induction of the new training coordinator who has settled into the delivery and development of the training with excellent feedback from participants. The greatest level of safeguarding training has been achieved this year with the majority being accessed by staff who have specific safeguarding roles with increasing representation from GP's and the Police.

The quality assurance of courses has demonstrated a consistent above average feedback for the course content, materials and delivery by trainers. The professional experience of the trainers within the pool has been linked more closely to the delivery of the differing levels of training. Further work is needed to complete the auditing of single agency safeguarding training (across all sectors).

The DSCB commissioned the development of a Leadership and Management course that was mandatory for all Children's Social Care Managers (including the Chair of the DSCB). The course successfully provided a unique learning experience for managers that focussed on the impact of safeguarding on their roles. The course was delivered, initially as a single agency course, to assist with the transition to locality based teams occurring in 2008 and this level 4 course will be further developed to be delivered to a multi agency audience over the coming

vear.

The links between of the Safeguarding Children Board Workforce Development Group and the Children and Young People's Partnership Children's Workforce Group has begun to be established with the inclusion of safeguarding training on the new Children and Young People's plan for Derby. This should contribute to ensuring that the training of all staff in Derby is strategically coordinated and effective. The further development of level 3 training around neglect will be a focus for the forthcoming year.

The DSCB supported the contribution of the group to the revision of the E Learning CD – Breaking the Cycle of Abuse and the creation of an Internet based E Learning package. This is an ongoing piece of work that is being carried out in participation with other agencies in Derbyshire, the NHS Hub and Internet training company and will see a more effective updated package made available both locally and nationally.

10 Community and Communication Group

The group meets on a bi monthly basis and whilst there has been a core membership further multi agency sign up and attendance is needed. The remit of the group is to:

- Establish a communication strategy
- Publicise and raise awareness of safeguarding and the promotion of children's welfare to the wider community.
- Distribute e learning and safeguarding information to Faith Groups
- Produce a regular newsletter.
- Set up and manage the DSCB website.
- Develop media and publicity strategy and improve awareness of the function and role of the Board
- Revise and update safeguarding leaflets
- Improve the consultation with and participation of service users.
- Establish Practitioner Groups
- Develop awareness campaigns arising from practice issues or serious case reviews

The group has successfully consulted upon the safeguarding leaflet for parents and carers, which is undergoing production in different languages and will be distributed in 2008.

Extensive consultation on guidance for the Voluntary, Community and Faith based organisations was successfully completed and, whilst temporarily delayed by the national implementation of the Independent Safeguarding Authority, will be published in 2008. Advice and guidance has been made available through the work of individuals for different Faith Groups.

The group was unable to move forward the development of the DSCB website and this will be a key area for completion during 2008 / 2009 whilst ensuring that the statutory functions of the DSCB are carried out.

The group has worked with Derbyshire LSCB to consult upon a leaflet, requested by Young People, advising the about legal issues and sexual activity.

There are some key actions for the Community and Communication groups arising from the stay safe element of the Children and Young People Plan.

11 Serious Case Review Group

The remit of the serious case review group is to:

- Ensure that serious case reviews are carried out according to regulations and guidance.
- Ensure that any recommendations are implemented, monitored and evaluated.
- Ensure that staff in all agencies are aware of the outcomes of serious case reviews and their part in action plans.
- Ensure that media coverage is appropriately managed.

It is noteworthy that this Group has not met during 2007/08 as there has been no requirement to carry out a serious case review.

12 Child Death Review Group

The group meets on a monthly basis to carry out the Child Death Review Process in respect of the deaths of all children in Derby. The remit of the Child Death Review Group when established is to:

- To collect and analyse information about child deaths
- To advise on ways to improve the well being of children based on the work of the group.

13 Review of the 2007 – 2008 DSCB Business Plan

The Board has continued to make significant progress during the last year. The DSCB steering group, which functions as the stay safe outcome group for the CYPP, has the responsibility to manage the partnership work to improve staying safe outcomes for local children and young people. The steering group has worked in partnership to develop the stay safe aims and outcomes for CYPP Plan 2008 - 2009.

The Board together with the steering / stay safe outcome group identified a number of key issues for 2007 – 08, not least being the ability to answer the question how well is the partnership working together to safeguard children?

The key message from the Annual Performance Assessment and Joint Area Review, both carried out during 2007 – 2008, was that the partnership is working well to safeguard children. The appraisal by the Board, and steering / stay safe outcome group of partnership arrangements is representative of judgements arising from external scrutiny and this is very encouraging.

The Board will be continuing to monitor performance using the framework attached at appendices 1 and 2. The Board will ensure that its functions are carried out in line with the Staying Safe aims and outcomes and to achieve this will set out the plans for future work and an audit programme.

Derby is a culturally diverse city and the Board has delivered on its priority to promote community awareness of safeguarding. Work has included the development and promotion of safeguarding materials for parents and the public in Derby (including in different languages) and expanded the engagement with local Faith Groups. For practitioners two new courses have been established to safeguard black and minority ethnic children and those at risk of forced marriage and honour based violence.

The Board has successfully implemented the child death review process and has continued to undertake its partnership approach to respond to allegations against staff.

Supporting children affected by domestic violence was an area prioritised for 2007 – 08. The short life task group was established to develop an outcome focussed action plan but this was not completed following the departure of key staff within the Community Safety Partnership. Crucial collaboration will be a key area for the development of an effective response to domestic violence by the Board alongside the CSP. The improvement of early identification, the development of practice guidance and establishing suitable services are essential elements to safeguarding the significant number of children and adults affected by domestic violence in Derby.

In order to complete its duties and prioritise resources the launch of a Website, that will serve as a resource for children and young people, families, practitioners and agencies, was delayed and will be a priority for the coming year.

14 Looking forward – The DSCB Business Plan 2008 - 2009

The Annual Performance Assessment and the Joint Area Review set out areas for action that will be reflected in the plans for both the Board and the CYP Plan. These include:

- Audit and review the cases of children waiting for adoption to see whether adoption is now a realistic choice.
- Review the policy of using unqualified workers for looked after children.
- Improve initial assessment timescales, following the implementation of the social care electronic recording system (now a public sector agreement indicator)
- Review the length of time of children in care with a permanence plan through adoption
- Develop an overarching strategy to bring together existing inter agency protocols for missing children

Further work identified by the Board includes:

- Review the Safeguarding Children Procedures
- Revue and implement the DCSF national guidance on safeguarding children who are sexually exploited (when published)
- Co-ordination of action to prevent, reduce and respond to domestic violence, including Multi Agency Risk Assessment Conferences (MARAC)
- Implementation of arrangements for Child Death Reviews
- Extending and developing Multi Agency Public Protection Arrangements
- Implementation of Independent Safeguarding Authority vetting and barring arrangements
- Establishing arrangements in schools to address honour based violence/forced marriage
- Implementing strategies to promote safeguarding within Faith Groups
- Develop the Board profile, to include induction of new members, and commissioning arrangements, and service users involvement
- Establish the E Safety Group to reduce harm to children via digital technology
- Implement with other agencies the transition from the use of the Child Protection Register to children subject of child protection plans in training
