31/14 Services for Older and Vulnerable residents in Derwent

The Board discussed the need for services to support elderly and vulnerable residents in Derwent ward.

Noted that the lunch clubs provided by Live at Home have moved out of Derwent and while they have been asked to see if Coniston Crescent or Max road Community rooms can be reconsidered no response yet received.

Other local lunch clubs are closing.

The Board is keen to promote lunch clubs in Derwent ward and these Derby Homes community rooms are available for community use and options could include working with partners such as Derby College.

To invite Roger Teague to update the Board on his ideas and options at the next Board meeting.

Action: Agreed to include an agenda item at next Board meeting on 'Support for Older and Vulnerable people in Derwent ward' and to invite Roger Teague to lead.

 are issues with second skips which will not be used in 2015. Consider using two

33/14 Section 106 Funding in Derwent,

The Board noted the report on the proposal from officers to contribute to delivery of 2015/15 LTP priority 1 using section 106 funding from Rhino Development of £13,305. Board expressed disappointment that £13.305 section 106 funding was proposed to enable their LTP priority to be delivered. Richard Smail informed the Board that relevant Section 106 funds were being identified by officers across the city to enable board LTP priorities to be delivered in 2015/16. Board recognised this was partially due to core budgets and other funding facing increasing pressures and that there was no benefit from waiting before allocating the available section 106 supported the proposal. The Board also considered options for the £1,100 section 106 funding from Rhi1-03 and suggested using to support the LTP priority on Sussex Circus.

Action: Richard Smail to report back the Board supported proposals for Rhi1-02 to deliver the LTP priority in 2015/16 and Rhi-03

The Board asked for a quote to maintain and paint the Nottingham Road railings to allow consideration to be given to ways to fund this work.

35/14 Neighbourhood Board Updates and activities

Police - Inspector Cannon reported:

- anti social behaviour (ASB) focussing on tackling issues on the racecourse and calls dramatically reduced
- Auto crime slight increase in thefts from vehicles
- Non dwelling burglaries increase
- Operation Ingomia continues on Friday and Saturday nights in response to ASB
- Drugs Progress being made on some specific drug issues with local operations in place. In recent weeks four drug warrants and all successful including one reported in the press on Radnor Street. Investigations are continuing in response to local intelligence received.
- Work being done to tackle handling stolen goods
- PCSO's have visited St Marks Road and Sussex Circus to assess parking obstruction complaints – no obstructions identified but advice given to drivers and businesses including Masala Nights on considerate parking.
- Police Service need to save £27 million in 2015/16 which will have an impact on staffing, but Insp Cannon reassured the Board he was aiming to ensure minimal impact on services.

Derby Homes – Pete Matthews reported:

- CCTV upgrade of about 50 cameras around flats near the racecourse and camera at Sussex Circus will be in place soon.
- ASB complaints static, there are now three ASB officers in post
- New build Hillcrest Road/Wiltshire Road open space building started on two bungalows.
- Huntingdon Green Derby Homes are funding new landscaped area behind the bus shelter

- Derby Homes developing their apprenticeship scheme
- Sussex Circus office being improved in next few months meaning the reception will be closed for 8 weeks during the refurbishment, alternative arrangements being investigated
- Derby Homes looking to purchase the recently vacated Social Services building next door.
- Derby Homes aim to fund Kickz again in 2015/16 along similar lines to 2014/15 to provide positive engagement and interventions for young people

Youth Service – Ruth Hardy attended at the end of the meeting and reported:

- Youth clubs progressing well with excellent attendance
- Half term activities being publicised in next few weeks
- Proposals to hold an 'opening' event for new the skate park will be fitted into the programme best day likely to be Monday 9 February.
- Delivery of the Board newsletter and no cold calling cards to be completed during February and leaflets needed by Friday 6 February.

Ruth thanked the Board for their in principle commitment to fund again in 2015/16.
