Presentation by Grant Thornton on the 2020 Vision - future of Local Government Finance and Policy

SUMMARY

- 1.1 Grant Thornton, Council's external auditor and University of Birmingham have jointly produced a paper on how local authorities may respond to the unprecedented challenges, including those relating to austerity and central government funding reductions, demographic pressures and technological change.
- 1.2 A senior manager at Grant Thornton has been invited to give a presentation to the Board and start the debate on how we may respond to future challenges.
