This Forward Plan supersedes all previous Forward Plans.

The Date of Consideration indicated is the earliest date by which it is proposed the Council Cabinet will consider the matter.

Summary – Currently the Council funds Derby's community dementia support services to assist people with dementia and their carers to remain independent in the community. They provide an ongoing contact point for information and advice, short courses/briefings for carers and a range of community activities eg dementia cafes, self help groups, peer support and befriending. The services support people to live independently within the community by accessing information and advice, developing the skills of carers, reducing isolation and developing peer support networks. The service picks up referrals from Memory Assessment Clinics and works closely with a wide range of other dementia support services in hospitals and the community. Similar services are funded in the County and there is a health funded information service running in the hospital to support people who attend clinics and wards for other health conditions. The outcomes and working methods of all these services are very similar although the environment in which they work varies. An opportunity has been identified to explore a joint tender process for all three services that will improve services for people with dementia and their carers and provide better value for money for the City Council and for the other commissioners. The joint process builds on the existing partnership work within dementia support services that has assisted the implementation of the Derby Dementia 2013-16 Strategy.
