Children and Young People's Plan 2016-17 Refresh

SUMMARY

- 1.1 The Council produces an annual refresh of the Children and Young People's Plan each year, updating key areas of focus and collaborative priorities for the Children, Families and Learners Board.
- 1.2 The plan identifies what organisations are going to do to deliver services to improve outcomes for the most vulnerable, and how they are going to do it.
- 1.3 The 2016-17 Children & Young People's Plan' (CYPP) refresh, as with the previous plans has been agreed in consultation with the members of the Children, Families and Learners Board. This is a partnership of key organisations providing services for, and which have an impact on children and young people and families in Derby.
- 1.4 The plan focuses on areas where better partnership working will really make a difference to the outcomes for our vulnerable children and young people.
- 1.5 The plan will be reviewed in March 2017 as a milestone delivery deadline and to meet new challenges.

The key shared priority areas for 2016/17 are:

- Children and young people are supported to achieve and become work ready;
- Improved health, emotional well-being and mental health for children and young people;
- Improve delivery for children and young people with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND).

- 4.2 The audience for the Children and Young People's Plan include internal staff groups, members of the public, local community groups, businesses and partner agencies. However, the report also meets internal reporting requirements to ensure rigorous review of the Plan and key performance targets.

- 4.3 As in the previous year, the plan demonstrates as a partnership the impact of working together to improve outcomes; making sure children, young people and their families are safe, healthy, achieving and aspire to fulfil their potential.

- 4.4 The framework for the work of the Children, Families and Learner's Board is provided through the Children and Young People's Plan, which is the sixth plan that the Board has published.
