SUSPENSION NOTICES

Since 25 April 2012, the Authority has been able to serve a suspension notice on those who hold a licence under the Licensing Act 2003, who have not paid their annual fees.

91 suspension notices were issued during period. The total outstanding was $\pounds 16,235$. 81 paid realising $\pounds 14,155$. Of the remaining 10, 4 licences were surrendered following the issue of the suspension notices, 4 suspensions remain in place, but the premises are not currently trading. 2 premises will be subject to a visit and potential formal enforcement action

INSPECTIONS

2 licensing inspections have been conducted during this period.
