Appointment of Co-optees to the Climate Change Commission Appointment to the Elizabeth Turner Charity

RECOMMENDATION

- 1.1 To approve the co-option of Peter Robinson, Bob Hewins and Jeremy Fisk to the Climate Change Commission for the 2009/10 municipal year.
- 2.1 To make an appointment of a Trustee of the Elizabeth Turner Charity.

SUPPORTING INFORMATION

- At its meeting on 16 June 2009 the Climate Change Commission agreed to recommend that Council approve the co-option of three people to the Commission for 2009/10. Members considered that each of the proposed co-optees would make a valuable contribution to the work of the Commission during the 2009/10 municipal year.
- 2.2 Peter Robinson is the chairperson of both the Derby Campaign Against Climate Change, and the National Campaign Against Climate Change. Peter has been a coopted member since the 2007/08 municipal year.
- 2.3 Bob Hewins also represents the Derby Campaign Against Climate Change, and offers a technical perspective on issues to the Commission. Bob was co-opted onto the Commission in the 2008/09 municipal year.
- Jeremy Fisk was co-opted onto the Commission in the 2008/09 municipal year. Jeremy works with C-Changes based in Etwall, which provides energy efficiency advice and services to home owners.
- 2.5 There is a long-standing vacancy for a Council-appointed Trustee of the Elizabeth Turner Charity. It is recommended that Council make an appointment to fill the vacancy.
