**38/06 Application for a Variation of Premises Licence at
The Bull and Bush, Henley Green, Mackworth,
Derby, DE22 4JG**

The Sub Committee considered a report from the Corporate Director of Environmental Services that detailed an application for a variation of premises licence at The Bull and Bush, Henley Green, Mackworth, Derby.

The application was received on 19 March 2007 from Michael Gallagher. Michael Gallagher and Caroline Gallagher attended and addressed the Sub Committee.

The variation applied for was for the additional hours for the sale of alcohol and additional activities. Also to remove the condition regarding children under 18 entering or remaining on the premises at 21.00.

It was reported that representations had been received from interested parties.

The Sub-Committee resolved to grant the application for a variation of premises licence for The Bull and Bush in the following way:

- **to extend the types of entertainment to be licensed to include exhibition of films, performance of dance, entertainment of a similar**

description, the provision of entertainment facilities for making music, dancing, entertainment of a similar description and the provision of late night refreshment;

- **to remove the condition regarding children under the age of 18 entering or remaining on the premises after 21:00 hours; and**
- **to extend the hours for the supply alcohol.**

In order to promote the 4 Licensing Objectives, the following conditions will be attached to the Licence:

MANDATORY CONDITIONS – SUPPLY OF ALCOHOL

1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence-
 - a. at any time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence; or
 - b. at any time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

MANDATORY CONDITIONS – EXHIBITION OF FILMS

3. No film shall be exhibited unless:
 - a. it has received a “U”, “PG”, “12A”, “15”, or “18” certificate of the British Board of Film Classification; or
 - b. it is a current news reel which has not been submitted to the British Board of Film Classification.
4. “18” Films
No person apparently under the age of eighteen years shall be admitted to any exhibition at which there is to be shown any film which has received an “18” certificate from the British Board of Film Classification.
5. “15” Films
No person apparently under the age of fifteen years shall be admitted to any exhibition at which there is to be shown any film which has received an “15” certificate from the British Board of Film Classification.
6. “12A” Films
No person apparently under the age of twelve years shall be admitted to any exhibition unless accompanied by an adult at which there is to be shown any film, which has received a “12A” certificate from the British Board of Film Classification.
7. “PG” Films
Some scenes contained at which there is to be shown any film, which has received a “PG” certificate from the British Board of Film Classification, may be unsuitable for young children.
8. “U” Films
Films suitable for all is any film, which has received a “U”, certificate from the British Board of Film Classification.
9. Permission of Licensing Authority
Notwithstanding the above, a film may be exhibited, or persons, or any class of person, may be admitted thereto if the permission of the licensing authority is first obtained and any conditions of such permission are complied with.

CONDITIONS RELATING TO CRIME AND DISORDER

- 10.** All Door Supervisors working on the Premises must be registered with the Security Industry Authority.
- 11.** You must maintain a CCTV system in good working order on the premises.
- 12.** The system must be operated at all times when the premises are open to the public.
 - All recordings must be retained for a minimum of 30 days.
 - All recordings must be shown to an Authorised Officer or Police Officer upon request.

CONDITIONS RELATING TO THE PREVENTION OF PUBLIC NUISANCE

- 13.** During regulated entertainment involving amplified music or speech, all windows to rooms in which the music or speech is taking place shall be kept closed and alternative acoustically attenuated ventilation shall be provided where necessary.
- 14.** During events involving amplified music or speech (other than that previously authorised under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 1964), all doors to rooms in which the music or speech is taking place shall be kept closed other than for access and egress.
- 15.** There shall be no amplified music or speech relayed via external loudspeakers.
- 16.** Other than background music, regulated entertainment involving amplified speech and music shall only take place in the function room. For the purpose of this condition, background music is defined as music that does not form a focus of entertainment and is generally inaudible outside of the room in which it is being played.
- 17.** You must nominate a representative to receive and respond to complaints throughout the duration of all noise generating events.
- 18.** The licensee or nominated representative shall monitor the noise from time to time outside noise sensitive premises during every event involving amplified music or speech. At least one such period of monitoring shall be undertaken after 11pm if regulated entertainment is taking place after that time. If, as a result of such monitoring, it is considered that the noise levels are excessive, immediate action should be taken to reduce the volume to acceptable levels. Your attention is drawn in particular to the effect of the low frequency bass notes which readily pass through doors and windows and are most often the principal reason for complaining of entertainment noise. The aim should be for noise to be inaudible outside noise sensitive premises after 11pm. A record of these checks and of any action taken as a result shall be maintained in a log book kept specifically

for that purpose. The log book shall be made available for inspection by an authorised officer of the licensing authority on request.

19. There shall be displayed at all exits, prominent, clear notices requesting customers to respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises and the area quietly.
20. Disposal of waste bottles into external receptacles where noise will be audible to residents in neighbouring properties must not take place between 2300 hrs and 0700 hrs the following day.

CONDITIONS RELATING TO THE PROTECTION OF CHILDREN FROM HARM

21. Children must be supervised at all times on the premises.
