How do we enable better collaboration with all key partners around locality issues? Service of place not silo.



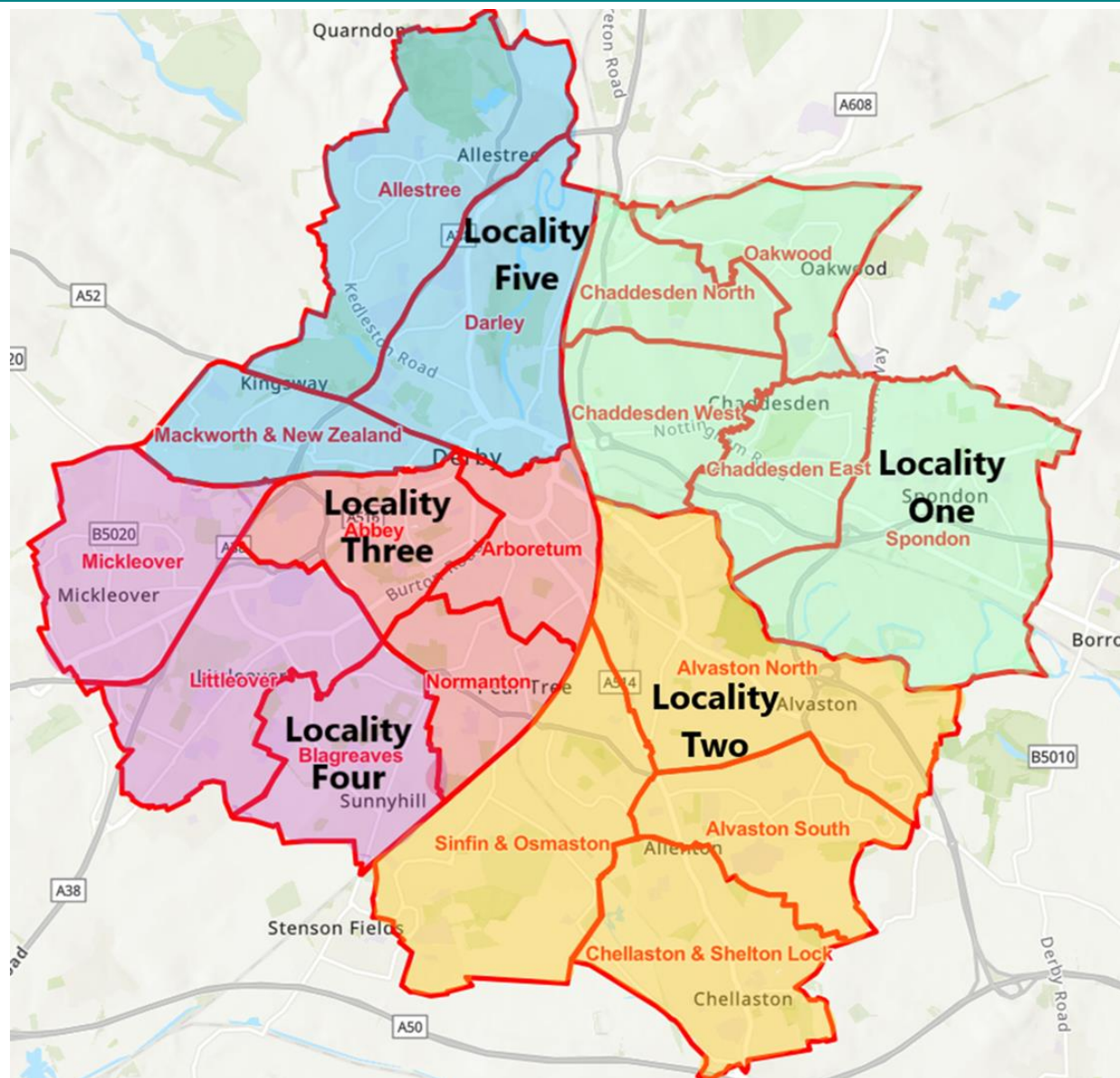
About us

Work across the team delivering a strengths-based approach in localities – improved outcomes for residents, their families and their community.

Ongoing work to support Community Hubs tackling the cost-of-living crisis

Increased focus on education and engagement work to reduce environmental crime and fly tipping.

Mental Health First Aid training for residents and those living and working in the city.

Team members trained as Falls Ambassadors working with health colleagues to build a network of Falls Champions across the locality

Local Area Coordination embedded in the DAU bridging to community orgs.

Bring qualitative data and qualitative information and intelligence together to identify possible priorities across people, place and partnerships – targeting and tailoring approaches.



Engaged, connected & independent communities

Drafting of communication and engagement plans for each locality including ongoing dialogue to reflect and review.

Work with ward members commenced late December 2023 – Relationships, public realm, balancing priorities, working together.

Building and strengthening relationships within our localities through community conversations

An ambition to support and grow partnerships in localities through existing forums

Supporting community leadership - supporting and promoting the work of the Derby Health Inequalities Partnership

Introducing system challenges into community conversations & supporting community orgs to think of strengths-based ways to address these.



Safe communities, proud of where they live

Bringing Public Protection Officers into the Locality service - working with residents to identify issues and solutions at a local level – bins on streets.

Increased focus on the enforcement of PSPO's in the city to address environmental crime and ASB

Supporting individuals to build connections, relationships and personal resilience through connections to community activities

Building trusting relationships in our communities to enable us to work together to address the challenges in our localities

Supporting community spaces to welcome everyone, reducing isolation

Taking a holistic approach to long standing community safety issues, viewing it through a different lens.



Working together

Being present in places where the people with the quietest voices turn up and amplifying those voices - Warm Spaces

Working with and as part of Team Up Derby:

- Supporting 'Healthy Lifestyles' event in Normanton Library.
- Blagreaves Library – health pop up; blood pressure monitor loan through Libraries.

The three Chaddesden neighbourhood boards coming together to fund starter kit to support Friends of Nottingham Rd Cemetery group.

Locality working - locality engagement events – pop ups - locality partnerships – shared plans – joint actions.

Supporting businesses - creation of a business forum in Locality Three; working with existing business partnerships to improve the street scene in Locality Two and proactive work with the BIDs in the City Centre in Locality Five.

Strengthening Partnerships – Derby Homes, Police SNT Tasking; BIDS Business Crime Reduction Partnership; Community Action Derby; Youth Alliance; DHIP; Warm Welcome Network, Social care, Primary care, DWP
