Report of the Head of Stronger and Safer Communities Unit

Transforming Area Panels into Neighbourhood Forums

SUPPORTING INFORMATION

- 1.1 The purpose of this report is to provide an update on the Area Panel review and to introduce proposals to roll out neighbourhood working across the city.
- 1.2 Area Panel 3 received a report about the Area Panel review on 17 January 2007 when it was agreed to report back to Area Panel 3 on the outcome of the review and any new arrangements that were proposed.
- 1.3 The Area and Neighbourhood Board, on behalf of Derby City Partnership, has concluded the review and proposes a new framework for neighbourhood working in Derby replacing Area Panels with a framework of Neighbourhood Forums.
- 1.4 A presentation will be made at the meeting on 20 June outlining the following proposals:
 - Area Panels transformed into Neighbourhood Forums
 - Neighbourhood Forums for each ward, led by Councillors and engaging with local residents
 - three levels of neighbourhood management will be developed
 - Neighbourhood Managers co-ordinate and deliver some services relating to the cleaner, stronger and safer communities agendas
 - a neighbourhood profile, neighbourhood plan and performance framework is developed

More details of the presentation are in Appendix 1.

- 1.5 Councillors are currently being invited to local briefing sessions to raise awareness of the proposals, to discuss the impact in their ward and to feedback their views. Presentations are being made at all five Area Panel meetings.
- 1.6 Council Cabinet will consider feedback from Area Panels and Councillor briefings and make a recommendation to Council in July 2007. Subject to approval in July, Council will receive a further report on the way forward in September 2007.
