Neighbourhood Management is key Government Manifesto commitment

- Politics of Empowerment 'new relationship between communities and public institutions'
- The ability for people to have a real say in decisions that affect the shape and course of their lives
- Bridging the gap between citizens and democracy

- Build neighbourhood partnerships, in priority estates
- Review and develop area structures
- Develop effective models of Community Leadership
- Review/redesign service areas of community safety and street care to fit with Area and Neighbourhood structures, then consider other service areas


