01/05 Apologies for Absence

Apologies for absence were received from Councillors Rawson, Troup and Webb, Edith Storer – EMASH, Amarjit Raju – Disability Direct and Ann Webster – Policy Directorate.

02/05 Late Items Introduced by the Chair

03/05 Declarations of Interest

There were no declarations of interest.

04/05 Minutes of the Previous Meeting

The Minutes of the meeting held on 19 May 2005 were agreed as a correct record and signed by the Chair subject to the addition of Sara Fletcher – Derby Access group in the representing group attendance.

05/05 Appointment of a New Co-opted Member

06/05 Equality Grants to Voluntary Groups 2004/05

The Committee considered a report from the Director of Policy detailing the grant payments to seven voluntary organisations and the current grants criteria.

Resolved to note the report.

07/05 Rights of Way Improvement Plan

The Committee considered an oral report from Ray Brown – Senior Planning Officer, on the Rights of Way Improvement Plan. He advised the Committee that the plan was introduced as part of the Path Act 2000. The Act would consider how paths were used for leisure and recreational purposes but would not address issues of path maintenance. O and would be looking at paths that were used for leisure and recreation. It also dealt with other path related issues except maintenance. The plan was a joint scheme between the City and County Council. that would be shared with Derbyshire County Council.

Ray Brown explained that the plan had not yet been produced as it needed to go through the consultation period first. A Local Access Forum had been set up as a consultation group for both the City and County Councils, and was currently recruiting locking for members to attend the meetings. Ray Brown commented that currently the forum had no disabled members and he would encourage disabled people from the advisory to apply for membership asked members of the Committee if they would like to contribute to the forum to raise issues of disability rights of access as there were no disabled people currently attending.

Applications to be a member of the Local Access Forum needed to be <u>recievedin</u> by the 8 August. The applications and any other information could be obtained from Mick Watts.

Resolved to note the report.

08/05 Derby Cityscape Master Plan

Mike Kaye presented a report to the Committee on the launch of the Masterplan by Derby Cityscape Limited. <u>Council The</u> officers had had discussions with the URC and their consultants to insure that the Council's policies for planning, transport, culture and property were taken into account. The exercise integrated key proposals that the Derby City Council had developed itself or in partnership <u>with</u> others.

Consultation on the Masterplan had taken place There had been some consultation exercises, which started in February 2004, with meetings with the public and circulation of the proposals to the media. Detailed development arising from that exercise would need to be consulted on. Further public consultation would be required on the detail of the Masterplan.

Nancy Pountain stated that disabled people needed a central accessible meeting room that had adequate parking facilities and asked if this could be integrated into the plans. Mike Kaye responded that these issues had been looked into during the early stages, but he would ensure the issues raised by the Committee were forwarded to Cityscape.stages but would take on board any suggestions that the Committee made, particularly disabled parking. Mick Watts informed the Committee that a contribution had already been made toward the plan through the DPAC Pproject Ggroup and that this would continue throughout the development.

Resolved to note the report.

09/05 Deaf Forum

Alison Hicking advised the Committee that after the success of the last Deaf Information day that was held in May, it was decided to hold the event every two years. Attendance was very good with over 300 people joining in the day of events.

It was noted that recently in the press an article had been published regarding the Council taking action to recognise comments that deaf people had made. This involved using a SMS messaging service to process comments. Alison Hicking asked that if anyone had any information regarding this, they could let her know.

10/05 Tactile Paving

Pat Taylor advised that at a previous meeting the Committee had recommended that national guidelines were followed regarding tactile paving within Connecting Derby and that unfortunately this had not happenedbeen done. It was important that the tactile paving colour that was being used was right as it affected visually impaired peopleblind people, especially the colour. It was noted that with the new buildings that had started to develop, support from the Committee was needed to ensure the right kind of tactile paving was used.

Dave Parnham Powner informed the Committee that the English Heritage Trust, which had contributed to the cost of Connecting Derby, preferred to have paving that did not stand out too much with the rest of the pavement. Dave Parnham Powner explained that it was important to remember that the paving was on trial throughout the city centre centre and there were currently five different types of paving. The review had not been conducted yet but any comments from the Committee would be taken to the Connecting Derby management boardreview meeting. It was noted that no complaints had been received yet regarding the paving.

Pat Taylor explained that a lot of blindvisually impared people had complained to Derbyshirethe Association for the Blind and that she would pass on the complaints to Dave Parnham.Powner.. Councillor Turner asked if it was possible to get a letter from the English Heritage Trust-explaining how they would look at schemes and involve disabled people in the future. Dave Parnham-Powner agreed to look into it and to take a Letter-report to the Connecting -Derby Project Management Connections Board to review it reviewing the city centre tactile paving.

11/05 International Day of Disabled People

Pam Thompson explained that the International Day of Disabled People was approaching and asked the Committee for any ideas for a theme for the day. Also a project group for the event would need to be set up.

Mick Watts suggested a transport theme for the day. The Disabled Discrimination Act was As part of the Disabled People's Act ?, it had extended the rights of disabled people to use public transport and a theme around transport would be helpful so that disabled people could work in partnership with transport providers on service accessibility issues see what was available. Discussion took place regarding the good aspects of public transport, ramps and audio speaking on buses. It was noted that any members that would like to be part of the project group were to contact Pam Thompson.

12/05 Derby Railway Station

Mick Watts informed the group that a meeting had taken place with the Managing Director of Network Rail and that he has expressed his support for improved station accessibility. A major programme of station improvements had been planned and the inclusion of lift access to the footbridge would be considered as part of the programme, the outcome was that new platforms were to be used and that as the platforms were being constructed lifts would be put in as well. Mick Watts explained that he had written to the Disability Rights Commission and he was told that the railway station involved a complex setpart of management arrangements which made securing reasonable adjustmentsthings difficult but they would look into it and gain legal advice. Mick Watts agreed to contact the commission now for an update. Any more information would be reported to the next meeting.

13/05 A – Boards

Mick Watts advised the Committee that athe report regarding A-boards had been seek_find-out- morefurther information about the-control of A-Boards from other authorities, <a href="white-whit-white-white-white-white-white-white-white-white-white-white-wh

Pat Taylor expressed concerns that people were still getting hurt because of the placementuse of A-boards on the pavement. As a result of this, an article had been written by Pat Taylor to be published in the Derby Association of the Blind bulletin expressing the legal support that could be provided in the case of an incident. It was noted that Pat Taylor would prefer to not publish the article but would need to if the desired zero tolerance outcome was not achieved. Mick Watts agreed to take the article to the meeting with Councillor Repton next week to gain the Council view on the issue. Councillor Turner agreed to write a letter to Councillor Repton to express the views of the Committee.

14/05 Minutes of the DPAC Project Group – 16 May 2005

Mick Watts raised an issue from the DPAC project group minutes regarding disabled people's parking in the city centre. It was noted that concerns had been raised by blue badge holders regarding the lack of enforcement of on-street the disabled people's parking spaces. After investigating into the matter, it was discovered that the Ppolice felt they no longer had the resources to enforce the blue badge holder parking regulations. had withdrawn from policing that area. Mick Watts had written to the Ppolice but had not received a response yet response yet.

15/05 Work Programme

Pam asked that members discuss the work programme with their organisations and advise any items to be included on the work programme at the next meeting. It was suggested that future meetings focused on particular themes. If members had any ideas it was agreed to contact Pam Thompson or Ann Webster.
