Volume and Outcomes of Councillor Complaints 2023/24

Purpose

- 1.1 To provide the Committee with an update on the volume and outcomes of Councillor complaints dealt with in the 2023/24 municipal year.

- 3.1 To update the Standards Committee on the volume and outcomes of councillor complaints dealt with in the 2023/24 municipal year.

Supporting information

- 4.1 Nine complaints have been received in the 2023/24 municipal year. All nine have been dismissed.
- 4.2 It is important to note that when a complaint is dismissed, this includes circumstances by which a subject member has taken steps to resolve a complaint by way of an informal resolution to the satisfaction of the Monitoring Officer. This could include a written apology or some other form of corrective action by the councillor concerned.
- 4.3 In accordance with the procedures for the assessment and review of allegations of breaches of the Councillors' Code of Conduct, five out of the nine complaints have been dismissed following an apology being issued by the subject member, either directly to the complainant or to the Monitoring Officer.
- 4.4 The Councillors' Code of Conduct and the Procedures for the assessment and review of allegations of breaches of the Councillors' Code of Conduct are attached at Appendices 1 and 2 respectively.
