Area Panel Budget Proposals 2005/6

SUPPORTING INFORMATION

- 1.1 The Area Panel 2 budget allocation for 2005/6 is £29,000. The Panel can also carry forward £11,309 from 2004/5.
- 1.2 The area panel is asked to consider the following applications:

- 1.3 A short summary of each project is attached to this report in Appendix 2.
- 1.4 The Area Panel Grant Appraisal Panel met on 1 August to appraise area panel funding applications against the new criteria agreed by Council on 21 April 2004. The purpose of the Appraisal Panel is to support the Area Panel to make decisions about whether to approve applications. These applications were submitted after the Appraisal Panel met and therefore no recommendations have been made.

- 1.5 The Council constitution states that Area Panels can 'use a delegated budget for local environmental and community purposes'. For applications that do not specifically refer to a local activity, consideration needs to be given to the appropriateness of allocating area panel funding. In deciding whether to support each application, the Panel will assess each funding request against its priorities.
- 1.6 The new funding criteria, included in the Council Constitution, says that applications need to provide a service in response to the needs of local residents and meet at least one of the following criteria:

- improve access for local people to existing services
- provide a service in response to an issue raised in a community update report
- contribute to improvements which will provide a benefit to local residents
- assist in providing an integrated service in response to an issue raised at an area panel meeting
- enable residents to participate in their community or at area panel meetings.

Applications also need to:

- provide evidence of need for the application
- show evidence that ongoing maintenance or revenue costs have been approved by the relevant Council department, if necessary.
- 1.7 The priorities for supporting an application are that it:
 - is from a voluntary or community group
 - shows evidence of match funding or self help
 - provides a service in response to the needs of local residents
 - will directly benefit people living in the geographical area covered by the area panel
 - show evidence of how the project will be sustained beyond the period of funding, if it is not a one-off project
 - contributes to the delivery of one or more of the Council's corporate objectives.
- 1.8 In most circumstances, the amount of funding that the area panel will award to an applicant will be between £50 and £2,000. However, the area panel does have the discretion to award more if it considers the application to be a priority for the area.

IMPLICATIONS

Financial

1.1 Area Panels must consider priorities within the Area when considering requests for funding. Not all requests that meet the criteria will be considered a priority. When supporting or rejecting an application over £1,000, the Panel must give reasons for its decision.

Legal

- 2.1 The Area Panel has delegated authority to use its budget for local environmental and community purposes.
- 2.2 Section 19 of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976 empowers the Council to offer grants to voluntary and other organisations to provide any recreational facilities.
- 2.3 Any decision involving the making of a grant or loan over £1,000 to any voluntary body is deemed to have a significant impact on two or more wards and is therefore a key decision.
- 2.4 After a key decision has been taken, the Director of Corporate services must publish a record of every executive decision taken at that meeting within two days of that meeting. The record must include a statement of the reasons for each decision and any alternative options considered or rejected at the meeting. No action will be taken on any such decision for five clear days from the date of publication.

SUMMARY OF APPLICATIONS

Applicant 1: Councillor Mark Tittley

Project: Fencing around Chellaston Park

Total cost of project: £2,025

Amount of funding requested: £1,525

Wards: Chellaston

Description

This project is to provide improved fencing around Chellaston Park along Swarkestone Road. Many local residents have requested that improved fencing is installed in the area. The current fencing along this section of the park is very unsightly and could be a potential health and safety risk.

Not only will the new fencing improve and make the area more attractive, it will also improve the safety of the area.

The fencing will be bow top steel fencing measuring 27 metres long and 1.2 metres high at a cost of £75 a metre. Commercial Services will contribute £500 towards the cost and install the fencing.

Commercial Services will also maintain the fencing.

Applicant 2: Sinfin Community Childcare

Project: Garden Improvements

Total cost of project: £9,000

Amount of funding requested: £500

Wards: Sinfin

Description

Sinfin Community Childcare - SCC is a Neighbourhood nursery, not for profit organisation, providing full and sessional childcare, catering for local working parents and people on courses. The outside play area is in major need of a revamp. Following a recent OFSTED inspection, hawthorn hedging and low branches on a Poplar tree situated by the baby unit, were pointed out as a hazard to the children whilst out playing, and was marked by OFSTED as an action needing immediate attention.

The group will be applying for a major funding bid for a complete revamp of the outside play area in the near future which will cost an estimated £9,000. However they are requesting area panel funding of £500 for the urgent removal of the offending hawthorn hedge and Poplar tree branches on the grounds of health and safety for the children.

The nursery caters for up to 110 local children during the day and before and after school. Many of the parents of these children attend training courses at SUPORT and receive free childcare due to them being in receipt of appropriate benefits. The play area is used by the children whilst in the care of the nursery. As part of the children's learning plans out door play is a requisite of the curriculum. It is also a requirement of OFSTED regulations and if this work is not carried out the future of the nursery could be in jeopardy, which would affect the lives of the local residents who are dependant on the care during working or whilst on training.

The play area will be improved by the removal of the hawthorn hedge, which will be replaced by more child friendly shrubs allowing the young children to play in a much safer and secure environment.
