The Council Cabinet considered a report on recommendations from the Overview and Scrutiny Commissions on the draft Revenue and Capital Budgets 2011/12 – 2013/14.

The Revenue Budget proposals were considered by the five Overview and Scrutiny Commissions at their meetings in January/February 2011. The Capital Budget proposals were considered by the Scrutiny Management Commission on 1 February.

Appropriate Cabiner Members and chief officers were supplied with the individual commissions' recommendations immediately after the wording was finalised by the respective chair and vice chair. This repeated the practice trialled in 2010 and allowed the fullest consideration to be given to the scrutiny input.

The recommendations of the individual Commissions and the reasons for these recommendations were as set out in the Appendices to the report.

The process set out in the Budget and Policy Framework Procedure Rules Required the Cabinet to formally consider the reports of the overview and scrutiny commissions and report to Council on how it had taken into account any recommendations made.

COUNCIL CABINET MINUTES – 16 February 2011 (including Budget and Council Tax Motion) Approved subject to the amendment of paragraph 1 of the motion to read:

- 1. To approve a budget requirement for Derby City Council for 2011/12 of £221,764,425 subject to:
 - a) reducing the savings on Climate Change, included on page 34 of Appendix 6 (Document 5C), by \$50,000 to be funded by bringing forward the saving of £293,000 for Community Transport from 2012/13 to 2014/12, shown on page 39 of Appendix 6 (Document 5C). This will be replaced in 2012/13 with permanent reductions in expenditure on energy, or failing that by reductions in posts within CCEMU.
