Report on the Education Commission Tour on 3 March 2005 and proposals for future visits and external meetings by the Commission

RECOMMENDATION

 That the Education Commission notes the report and agrees the suggestion outlined below for future meetings and external visits by the Commission.

SUPPORTING INFORMATION

- 2.1 The Education Commission Tour on 3 March 2005 visited six Derby schools. The schools were selected by the Education Service to illustrate the wide range of condition, age and overall suitability prevailing within Derby schools. Those members who took part in the tour were in general agreement that it provided helpful insight into the problems faced by teachers and pupils at some schools, and into the difficulties faced by the Education Service when trying to address those problems.
- 2.2 In order to build upon this experience, and to provide the Commission with information that will subsequently be useful when considering proposals and formulating recommendations, it is suggested that the Commission should hold some of its future business meetings at school premises and that it should conduct more visits to Education Service premises in Derby.
- 2.3 Commission members are asked for their views on this suggestion, and, if they are in favour, to suggest premises that they consider the Commission should visit. It is felt that it could prove very informative for the Commission to visit the Schools PFI sites. This could be done within the next month or so.
