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Prevention and Health Inequalities Board Update

Purpose

- 1.1 To provide the Integrated Care Partnership (ICP) with an update on the establishment of a Prevention and Health Inequalities Board (PHIB) in the Joined Up Care Derbyshire System

Recommendations

- 2.1 To note the progress made since the agreement at the ICP held on 18th October to establish a PHIB.

Reason

- 3.1 Increasing prevention activity and tackling health inequalities are core priorities for the JUCD system, to improve the health and wellbeing of the population and ensure that the system meets the needs of every community.
- 3.2 The ICP has agreed the establishment of the PHIB to provide the ICP with the mechanism to ensure health inequalities are addressed systematically and prevention activity increases across the system. Additionally, this will support the long planned 'left shift' in funding as well as clarity of governance.

Supporting information

- 4.1 As previously reported, preventing ill health and tackling health inequalities are separate but closely linked agendas that, taken together, are critical to improving the health and wellbeing of the population and reducing unfair and avoidable differences in health outcomes.
- 4.2 At its last meeting, the ICP agreed to establish the Prevention and Health Inequalities Board (PHIB) to provide strategic direction, coordination and oversight of the prevention and health inequalities agendas across the whole system.
- 4.3 Since the last meeting of the ICP, the strategic leads have further met to discuss how to most effectively progress and consider the key elements of the Terms of Reference following the discussion held at the ICP in October.
- 4.4 The Terms of Reference are currently being drafted and will be discussed and agreed at the first meeting of the PHIB and will be brought to the next ICP for its review and approval.
- 4.5 On the 28th November, NHS England's statement on information on health inequalities (<https://www.england.nhs.uk/publication/nhs-englands-statement-on-information-on-health-inequalities/>) was published. This statement on information on health inequalities (Statement) is given by NHS England further to its duty under [section 13SA of the National Health Service \(NHS\) Act 2006](#) to publish a Statement setting out a description of the powers available to relevant NHS bodies to collect, analyse and publish information, and the views of NHS England about how those powers should be exercised in connection with such information.
- 4.6 The Statement and its implications for Derby and Derbyshire Integrated Care System will be considered by PHIB.
- 4.7 A further update will be provided at the next ICP meeting to:
 - Provide an overview and update of the first meeting of the PHIB.
 - Receive for approval the Terms of Reference agreed by the PHIB.
