Not fit for purpose - Refurbished and Remodelled

- accommodate 30% more staff
- 780 desks to accommodate at least 1,014 staff.
- save on repair and maintenance bills of around £3m
- energy-efficient saving a further £1m
- The average cost of a desk space, taking into account heating, electricity, lighting and other overheads, is £6,422 per year and, by sharing desks we could save a further £1.5m a year



### **One Stop Shop**

- · Sited at the corner of Albion Street and East Street
- · All Customer facing services relocated here
- Open Plan Ground Floor
- · Extended opening
- · Interview spaces for others
- Improved Access overall



### **One Stop Shop**

- 1st and 2nd Floors for Telephony and Customer Service staff
- · Aligns teams naturally
- · Focuses on the customer journey
- · Staff relocated by November



### **Heritage Gate**

Celtic, Saxon, Roman and Norman

- · Existing use to be rationalised
- · Additional space leased
- · Public meetings held at Saxon House.
- · Staff relocated by December
- Estimated cost of £2.3m in 2010/11 and £2.6m in 2011/12



## **Equality Impact Assessment**
