# PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO CAR PARKING CHARGES -APRIL 2014

ITEM 4

# SUMMARY

1.1 This report sets out proposed changes to car parking charges to be introduced from 7th April 2014.

# RECOMMENDATION

2.1 That the proposed changes to car parking charges, set out within this report, are introduced with effect from Monday 7<sup>th</sup> April 2014.

## REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATION

3.1 The change in charges is necessary to meet inflation pressures.

## SUPPORTING INFORMATION

- 4.1 The proposal to increase car parking charges is necessary to meet inflation pressures with the Parking Services account. Indicative budget allocations for 2014/15 require an additional £100k of income generation from parking activities.
- 4.2 It is proposed to add 10p to each and every charge that currently applies to both onstreet and off-street parking areas. This is the minimum increase that can be applied.
- 4.3 There will be no change in the charge made for resident only parking permits and all season ticket prices will remain the same.

1.1 The proposed increases in parking charges are expected to generate an additional £100k per annum. Subject to approval of the Council's budget for 2014/15 the increases will likely be sufficient to meet the inflationary pressure on car parking income.
