Welcome to our Health Briefing

Derby City Primary Care Trust works to improve the health of people across the city and make sure the health services they need are available. Our job is to:

- work out what is needed to improve local people's health
- provide some services ourselves such as community services including clinics, district nurses. children's services and health visitors
- buy some services from others such as larger hospitals and specialist treatments.

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Drug Treatment Consultation

Derby Community Safety Partnership, working in partnership with the PCT, reviewed adult drug treatment services within the city in autumn 2005. Initial consultation with stakeholders resulted in a new way of providing drug treatments

being proposed. This is now formally being consulted upon.

Announcement of date for implementation of smoke-free law

Derby City Primary Care Trust has welcomed the announcement of the implementation date for smoke-free laws in England. From Sunday 1st July 2007, virtually all workplaces and substantially enclosed public areas in England will become smoke-free.

The introduction of smoke-free environments will reduce the risks to health from exposure to second-hand smoke, recognise a person's right to be protected from harm and enjoy smokefree air, help people trying to give up smoking and save thousands of lives over the next decade by reducing both exposure to hazardous secondhand smoke and overall smoking rates.

As part of Derby City PCT's and Derby City Council's commitment to the Smokefree Derby initiative, the Fresh Start NHS Stop Smoking Service has been working with local employers since the start of the year in order to help them prepare for

legislation. So far, more than 600 businesses across Derbyshire have been supported with advice on no-smoking policies and on site stop smoking groups for staff. Fresh Start will continue to support local employers and employees in the run up to 1 July 2007.

Derbyshire organised two Disability
Equality Events in November. The first
was held at The Spot in Derby and asked
over 100 local disabled people, carers
and advocates for their views on how we
can make a first class health service for
disabled people in Derbyshire. The
second event, held at Kingsway Hospital,
asked how disabled people should be
involved in developing future services and
how they can be empowered to scrutinise
the NHS on delivering disabled people's
recommendations.
