# Determination of Admission Arrangements for Community and Voluntary Controlled Schools 2007 - 2008

#### **SUMMARY**

- 1.1 The Council has consulted as required on the proposed admission arrangements and relevant area for 2007-2008. Following consultation, it is proposed that our current admission arrangements, set out on page 9 of the Secondary 'Admissions Handbook 2006-2007 and page 7 of the Primary 'Admissions Handbook 2006-2007, found at <a href="http://www.derby.gov.uk/EducationLearning/SchoolAdmissions/AdmissionsInformation.htm">http://www.derby.gov.uk/EducationLearning/SchoolAdmissions/AdmissionsInformation.htm</a> should be adopted as our arrangements for 2007-2008.
- 1.2 Subject to any issues raised at the meeting, I support the following recommendations.

#### RECOMMENDATIONS

- 2.1 Amend the admission arrangements for 2007 / 2008 as follows:
  - To accept the additional tiebreaker within categories 2 to 6 of giving first priority outside the normal admissions to pupils who have not been on a city school roll during the academic year of application.
  - Minor date changes for Primary and Secondary transfer.
  - Published Admission Numbers have no changes but a proviso regarding Children Centres that may lead to some changes.

#### REASON FOR RECOMMENDATIONS

3. To accept the additional tiebreaker would result in those families moving into Derby having priority over a family already on a waiting list whose child currently attends a school in the city. This would allow some parents the possibility of gaining access to their normal area school, although this outcome is not guaranteed and may affect only a small number of pupils.

# Determination of Admission Arrangements for Community and Voluntary Controlled Schools 2007 - 2008

#### SUPPORTING INFORMATION

- 1.1 The School Standards and Framework Act 1998, as amended by the Education Act 2002, requires admission authorities to determine their admission arrangements annually, with certain exceptions, and to consult other local admission authorities in the relevant area before doing so. Our relevant area is the Council's administrative area. The 2002 Act requires the consultation about admissions for September 2007 to be completed before 1 March 2006 and be determined by 15 April 2006.
- 1.2 We have consulted as required on our proposed admission arrangements and relevant area for 2007-2008. The consultation included all schools in Derby, as well as Derbyshire County Council and schools in Derbyshire that border the city. One response critical of the proposed new arrangements was received, as detailed in paragraph 1.6. No other responses critical to the proposal were received. The number affected by this additional tiebreaker cannot be quantified, but it remains a problem for parents. The use of the tiebreaker would allow for more control over such situations.
- 1.3 Dates given on page 6 of the primary booklet about requesting a place for all Derby City primary schools need to reflect deadline for the co-ordinated scheme of 15 December 2006. The offer date will be the 6 April 2007
- 1.4 Dates given on page 5 of the secondary booklet about requesting a secondary school place need to reflect the deadline for the co-ordinated scheme of 23 October 2006. The national offer date will remain as 1 March 2007.
- 1.5 The additional tiebreaker was objected to by one infant school as the governors felt that it would be unfair to give priority to someone new to the area. They believe that in-area children travelling to another school should have priority. The inclusion of the additional tiebreaker would ensure that children moving to Derby outside to the normal admission round are not penalised by having to move schools midway through an academic year
- 1.6 The Published Admission Numbers carries a proviso that admission limits may need to be reviewed at some schools as part of any Children's Centre proposals linked to the second phase of centres. Until the second phase has been finalised, which may not be in this academic year, these numbers cannot be assessed.
