Strategic Intelligence Assessment

SUMMARY

- 1.1 Since 2007 the local authority under its lead role in the Community Safety Partnership is required on a statutory basis to prepare an annual strategic intelligence assessment (SIA).
- 1.2 The purpose of the SIA is to identify the key risks and threats relating to crime and community safety in the city for the forthcoming year. This document then forms the evidence base of the three-year crime and disorder plan which is also a statutory requirement.
- 1.3 The SIA is developed by identifying and taking account of a range of factors including:
 - Levels and trends of recorded crime in the city
 - Public perception and feedback
 - National and regional crime trends
 - Strategic risk horizon scanning
- 1.4 The SIA has the following content:
 - Derby's neighbourhoods based upon crime and community safety issues
 - Analysis of the 7 identified priorities:
 - 1. Anti-Social behaviour
 - 2. Youth Crime
 - 3. Domestic Abuse
 - 4. New Communities and Cohesion
 - 5. Substance Misuse
 - 6. Gangs and Organized Crime Groups

7. High Risk Offenders
