Comment from IRO reporting back after meeting with YP :-

"I have been out to see YP today and he is happy with the support and advocacy that he has received from your advocate and feels that the things that he has wanted to happen have been achieved and progress has been made. He does not feel that he needs further advocacy at this time and does not need advocate to attend his review next week. I have suggested to YP that if he changes his mind on further advocacy at any time, I or one of the workers at the residential home can quickly get back in touch with you and YP is happy to leave it like that."

Issue based advocacy matters: Change Grow Live provide Independent Advocacy for all looked after children and care leavers from Derby City, either by referral from others or direct contact with our service. Independent advocacy ensures the wishes and feelings of the child/young person are heard, young people remain at the centre of all decision making, and their rights are protected.

Whenever possible, advocates seek resolution on behalf of the young person. Overall, the largest number of matters arose relating to living arrangements followed by support to prepare for a review. Occasionally a young person will choose to raise a formal complaint. During 2022-23 no formal complaints were raised.

Independent Advocacy at residential homes in Derby: Change Grow Live provide monthly 'clinics' to four Local Authority children's residential homes in Derby.

Why use the Independent Visitor Service? It helps to integrate children and young people into their local community and reduces isolation. Drawing volunteers from their local area helps build relationships, encourages compassion and in turn improves community cohesion.

Activities: A few special activities volunteers arranged with their CYP:

- Women's Football League cup match and League football matches
- Starr Circus events in Derbyshire and Nottinghamshire
- Walks in Peak District and cave tours
- Visits to various National Trust venues
- Christmas wreath making and visits to see Santa at various locations

When asked if they feel better since going out with their independent visitor some YP said:

- "Yes. I feel more confident"
- "Yes, because I get a break from my sister"
- "Yes, because I have got confident about going out on my own"
- "Yes, because it keeps me busy"
- "It gives me something to look forward to"
- "Fun, enjoyable"

When asked if they believe the young person has benefited from the service, some carers commented:

"YP has become more confident in doing things on her own (without her brothers) and enjoys going out with her IV"

"YP has grown in confidence with his IV. He found it really tough at first as he doesn't feel comfortable with people he doesn't know really well."
