
## 2016/17 Performance Results Looked after Children and Young People

#### **Derby's looked after population**

- At the end of March 2017 there were 448 children in care, a rate of 76.1 per 10,000 population.
- There were 200 new entrants to care in 2016/17 compared to 208 exits over the same period.
- The largest percentage of looked after children and young people were placed outside of the city, 61.4%, which has risen by over 9% from the end of March 2016.
- 61.5% of Derby's children and young people in a foster placement were placed with an Independent Fostering Agency.



Derby's services for looked after children were judged by Ofsted to be 'good' in March 2017.

# Outcomes for Derby's looked after children and young people

 10.3% of children looked after for 12 months or more experienced 3 or more moves; with 69.3% of children and young people in the same placement for 2 or more years

### Health needs

- 92.6% of children had received their annual health check with 81.6% of under 5's having two checks in a year
- 97.7% of immunisations were up to date
- 84.1% of dental checks were up to
- 79.1% of SDQs were completed with an average score of 16.2

- 17.6% of looked after children exited care through adoption or a special guardianship order
- On average it took 732 days for a child to move in with an adoptive family from entering care with 44.7% of CYP waiting less than 16 months

### Outcomes for Derby's care leavers

At the end of March 2017:

- 58.2% of care leavers were in employment, education and training
- 87% of care leavers were in suitable accommodation.
