Key Decisions

161/22 Long Term Waste Contract

The Council Cabinet considered a report which gave an update on the development of the Full Business Case relating to the future use of the New Waste Treatment Facility (NWTF) and to sought approval to the proposed next steps in relation to the NWTF.

The Executive Scrutiny Board made 3 recommendations to Council Cabinet.

Options considered

- 1. The options narrowed down for exploration were:
 - To rectify defects and use the facility and,
 - To close the facility and dispose of the councils' waste using a third party.

2. Details of the option considered were set out in paragraphs 7.1 to 7.3 of the report.

Decision

- 1. To approve plans to repair and bring into operation the waste treatment centre in Sinfin. Derby City Council and Derbyshire County Council would now go out to the market to appoint specialist contractors to carry out the rectification work and operate the facility. A further report would be brought back to Cabinet members at both councils, at a later date, to consider the award of contract(s) for this work.
- 2. Details of the recommendations which were approved, were set out in paragraphs 2.1 to 2.13 of the report.
- 3. To reject recommendation 1 from the Executive Scrutiny Board.
- 4. To accept recommendations 2 and 3 from the Executive Scrutiny Board.

Reasons

- 1. Rectifying the facility would give the councils more certainty over the cost of dealing with household waste that residents either cannot or choose not to recycle.
- 2. Details of the reasons were set out in paragraphs 3.1 to 3.13 of the report.
