Summary – Highway safety inspections are designed to ensure the network is safe and routinely checked for defects likely to create danger or serious inconvenience to users of the highway network. In October 2016, new guidance was launched; Well Managed Highway Infrastructure Code of Practice. It recommends that the safety inspection regime and defect repair regime should be based on risk, in accordance with local needs, priorities and affordability. There are no longer explicit or prescriptive minimum standards published at which an authority should intervene and repair a defect. It is for local authorities to determine appropriate levels of service and be able to demonstrate clearly what has informed that approach. Local authorities have had two years to implement the new code. This report outlines our approach.
