The role of this Commission is to receive reports, presentations and other information to enable it to consider the extent to which the Council meets its statutory responsibility in relation to looked after children and how it is working corporately to make leisure, employment and housing opportunities available to young people. Since the Commission mainly meets on a quarterly basis, it is proposed that a cyclical work plan is established to maintain focus on the major aspects of the services. It should be noted that adopting a work plan should not restrict the Commission solely to these agenda items and it may consider other issues as appropriate.
