Dear Sirs,

I wish to make representations regarding the application to vary the Premises Licence by Derby Rugby Football Club. Details of the application: Exhibiting of films on the pitch on Thursday to Sunday evenings from 17.00 to 23.00. Prevention of Crime and Disorder: Unless the Rugby Club are going to erect security fencing around the public viewing area then access to the site is limited only by rail fencing at the roadside or through a rough hedge at the opposite side. No Security is indicated for the site unless heavy

attendance bookings are made.

The prevention of Public Nuisance: The showing of films together with the soundtrack loud enough for all the viewers to hear clearly could be annoying for the residents of Folly Road/Haslams Lane. Additionally, late night departures from the car park and/or local streets would be unwelcome to house holders. The fact that alcohol is allowed at the site, as well as being available from the club bar also raises concern.

The Protection of Children from Harm: The lack of any security and no organised seating arrangements, together with the availability of alcohol could be a recipe for disaster with young children's sense of adventure and curiosity for investigating strange places.

Public Safety: Lack of security, open fencing, unlimited availability of alcohol.

The above items are my reasons for objecting to this application.

It would appear, as already advertised by QUAD (in advance of the application being granted), that this is only to be a one-off event for two nights 25th and 26th August. Why is it necessary to apply for a four evenings per week variation to the licence in perpetuity?? Would not a temporary variation be adequate?

Quad are advertising "spectacular fireworks" following the screening. In an area surrounded by residential properties we feel this is most unsuitable and it will be a very unwelcome and inconsiderate disturbance of the peace so late in the evening.

As mentioned to one of your employees, the copy of this Application was badly displayed by the Rugby Club, indeed one notice was lying in the grass soaked with rain. The notice gives a closing date for representations of 3^{rd} June 2017, whereas you apparently have 2^{rd} June as closing date. Also the notice displayed advises that "details of the

application may be inspected between the hours of 10am and 15.30pm from Mon-Fri inclusive, at the offices of the Licensing Team. We were told on arrival at the Council House that the department closes at 12.45pm and has done so since the end of last year. Perhaps somebody should tell whoever prints the notices??

To whom it may concern

l am writing to express concern in relation to the application by Derby Rugby Football Club to vary its premise license to show open air films.

am concerned that at least one of the four licensing objectives will not be met, specifically:

- 1) Public safety vehicular movements on Haslams Lane and through Darley Abbey Mills are already greatly enhanced and this will add to to that flow especially at night when there is insufficient street-lighting and no pavements to ensure public safety.
- open air cinema will generate high levels of noise and light pollution directly adjacent to a residential street on two evenings preceding school and work. How loud will the 2) The prevention of public nuisance - I understand that the licence variation is for films to be shown on potentially FOUR consecutive (Thu-Sun) nights up to 11:30pm. An noise levels be as nothing is said in the application? How many weekends will be taken up with films being shown?
- 3) The prevention of crime and disorder the application states that security would only be used if ticket sales were high although no mention is made of what constitutes "high" or (more importantly) the maximum number of people permitted at the event. However, public events should have marshals and security irrespective of attendance levels especially when alcohol is available on site.
- 4) The protection of children from harm many children live on Folly Road adjacent to the rugby club so will be impacted by increased noise and light levels as per (2)

I also have an issue with how this application has been conducted "under the radar". Despite living adjacent to the rugby club I only found out that film showings were planned when we received an advert from the Quad that the films were going to be shown. I have received nothing from the rugby club itself. Further, I understand that licensing authorities are required to advertise licence applications "in a manner likely to bring the application to the attention of persons likely to be affected by it." I'm not sure this has happened either. I'm not against a one-off event when the impacts can be properly assessed but to give an open-ended variation for up to four showings every week until 11:30pm seems illconceived to me,


- 1. Why has the application not been fully filled in
 - a. Part 4, why has I and J not been ticked.
 - b. B why has this sheet not been completed presumably it is outdoors, what is the seasonal variation
 - c. I and J not completed (they should have been ticked as per a. above)
 - d. K, L, M to be completed in all cases
 - i. K not included in the application I have seen
 - ii. L-why 08:00 to 24:00, different to times in B
 - iii. M, why are boxes b,c, d and e not completed fully?
- 2. Given the limited information on the application, my concerns are:
 - a. Public nuisance noise, I can easily hear the noise (music) from the wedding venue (above the noise of the weir) when they have a band outside (or the one occasion they had the windows open and the disco was on), so it can be assumed that the noise from an open air cinema will be worse given the distances and geography and volume. Front bedrooms in houses on Folly Road should be able to have windows open in the summer without noise disturbance. Residents with children or residents with mental wellbeing issues need to know that they can go to bed at a reasonable time and not be disturbed. 23:30 is far too late (particularly on nights before school or work).



- It will also cause excessive noise if the license is given as customers shut car doors, start engines and leave after the film.
- b. Public safety and protection of children from harm. Parking Folly Road is an adopted residential road. We already suffer from use as a car park by gym members from the Mill, as well as overflow of Rugby. Parking causes access issues and concerns over the safety of pedestrians (children) and walkers (a popular dog walking route). It will also cause excessive noise if the license is given as customers shut car doors, start engines and leave after the film.
- c. Crime and disorder the license states that alcohol (not alcahol!) can be brought by customers, as well as purchase from the rugby club licensed bar. This raises concern over increased disorder in the area. The site is an easy walk from many areas of Derby, and you only have to visit the green outside the Abbey Pub on the other side of the village to see the shouting and threatening behaviour that occurs on a sunny day when the number of beers gets the better of some.

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence
 - a. at any time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence; or
 - b. at any time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- 2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

MANDATORY CONDITIONS - DOOR SUPERVISION

3. Each individual required to be at the premises to carry out a security activity must be licensed by the Security Industries Authority.

MANDATORY CONDITION IMPLEMENTED ON 28 MAY 2014.

- 1. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- 2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1 —(a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;

- (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula P = D + (DxV) Where P is the permitted price.
- (ii) D is the rate of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence—
- (i) the holder of the premises licence,
- (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
- (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "valued added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994
- 3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 4. (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
- (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

MANDATORY CONDITIONS IMPLEMENTED 1 OCTOBER 2014

1. (1). The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises."

(2) An irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for

consumption on the premises -

- (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to –
- (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or

(ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);

- (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective.
- (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective.;
- (d)) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner).
- (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- 2. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 3. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- (2) The Designated Premises Supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy
- (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either
- (a) holographic mark or
- (b) an ultraviolet feature
- 4. The responsible person must ensure that -
- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures –
- (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
- (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
- (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and

- (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises: and
- (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

ANNEX 2 - CONDITIONS CONSISTENT WITH THE OPERATING SCHEDULE

- 1. Full training shall be provided to all staff on commencement of employment relating to all age restricted products sold and any system or procedures they are expected to follow in the course of dealing with these goods.
- 2. Refresher training shall be provided at regular intervals- at least every 12 months.
- 3. Records detailing the training provided shall be kept on the premises for production upon request by a Police Officer or an authorised officer as detailed within Section 13 of the Licensing Act 2003.
- 4. All records must be written and shall be retained on the premises for a minimum of 12 Months.
- 5. A challenge 25 or similar Proof of age scheme will be operated at all times.
- 6. Anyone attempting to purchase alcohol (or other age restricted product) that appears under the age of 25 years will be asked to produce a proof of age.
- 7. The only acceptable forms of identification will be:
- a) PASS accreditation proof of age card
- b) Photo driving licence
- c) Current passport
- 8. A system of recording sales refused under the proof of age scheme shall be operated at all times.
- 9. The refusals book/log shall be kept on the premises for production upon request by a Police Officer or an authorised officer as detailed within Section 13 of the Licensing Act 2003.
- 10. The records relating to the refusals book/log shall be retained on the premises for a minimum

- 11. The DPS shall ensure that a written incident log is maintained within the premises and details of all incidents are recorded within the log. This log shall be kept on the premises for a period of not less than 12 months and shall be produced upon request of a Police Officer or other authorised person as detailed within Section 13 of the Licensing Act 2003.
- 12. The Premises Licence Holder will devise and promote a drugs policy. The policy will be adhered to at all times the premises are open for licensable activities.
- 13. The requirement for SIA registered Door Supervisors and toilet attendants is to be risk assessed and agreed with the local police licensing representatives.
- 14. All external doors and windows to remain closed at all times when regulated entertainment is being offered at the premises save access and egress.
