Emotional health and wellbeing needs	Yes	Current high level of concern around a young person at Cricklewood. Search for alternative placement.
Youth Offending	Yes	Two young people currently involved with YOS
Missing	Yes	A core of young people in residential care are regular missing persons (currently 4) and discussed in the monthly Missing Person's Monitoring group. Some of whom are either at risk of CSE/Reviewed under CSE strategy, SEND, involved with YOS or all three issues. No missing person episodes for two months in a row at Bute Walk.
Not in employment, education or training	Yes	One young person who is NEET (post 16yrs). Sporadic attendance and low engagement by some other young people in some of the Homes

Substance misuse	Yes	Work on going with the young people across the Homes and screening tool completed for each young person Intermittent issues with substance misuse but currently only occasional.
Domestic violence	No	
Radicalisation / extremism		Concerns have previously been

		raised in respect of one young person at Cricklewood. No known issues at present.
Bullying (including cyber bullying)	No	Not currently
Inappropriate accommodation (homelessness/b & b)	No	
Key considerations for the Children in Care Council	Yes	Slightly improved engagement from some of the young people. Consideration for other platforms to engage the young people in the CiCC may need to be considered (eg. Social media)
