SUSPENSION NOTICES

Since 25 April 2012, the Authority has been able to serve a suspension notice on those who hold a licence under the Licensing Act 2003, who have not paid their annual fees.

6 suspension notices were served during this quarter. A total of £860 was outstanding. All fees have now been paid.

INSPECTIONS

3 routine licensing inspections have been conducted during this period.

14 annual animal licensing inspections have been carried to renew licences due at the end of the year. 8 animal boarding establishment licences and 6 pet shop licences.
