The applicant Mr Barham Aziz, who is also appointed as the Designated Premises Supervisor, has applied for a new premises licence, to allow the sale of alcohol from 0600 – 0000, seven days a week.

The location of this application is Normanton Road, Derby which is a street consisting of business and residential properties. Derbyshire Constabulary receives regular complaints of street drinking and anti-social behaviour in this and the surrounding local areas.

Street drinking is essentially a group of individuals, many with alcohol dependency, gathering in an area for a common purpose, which is consuming alcohol to get intoxicated. Once intoxicated street drinkers then go on to commit crime and disorder, anti-social and intimidating behaviour towards residents, workers and visitors in the area.

Street drinking and associated anti-social behaviour can impact on people's perception of the physical environment and more importantly their quality of life and safety. Groups of drinkers can sometimes stop people using public spaces due to intimidation.

There are criminal offences associated with street drinkers ranging from assaults, thefts, begging, public order offences and public urination. The safer neighbourhood team in the Normanton and the City Council are constantly trying to combat the effects of street drinking by disruption tactics, applications for PSPO (public space protection orders) and community engagement.

People who participate in street drinking usually have limited funds available to purchase alcohol and on many occasions their income comes from begging. Therefore they are looking to purchase as higher strength alcohol possible in single units. Which is why lager and cider are preferred over spirits which are more expensive.

The existing situation is that high strength alcohol is so readily available in the area already due to the high saturation of off licences. When officers or public protection officers take positive action with street drinking it is impossible to trace the premises which has sold the alcohol in the first place.

The early and late opening hours of the premises, would allow the opportunity for the street drinking fraternity in the area to have ready access to such alcohol for a large proportion of the day and this would lead to a likely increase in anti-social behaviour in an already saturated area.

My correspondence with the applicant, Mr Aziz highlighted the issues with street drinking in area of the new premises licence, which he agreed was a problem also. That being said the application did not include any conditions attached to the operating schedule for the prevention of anti-social behaviour or street drinking despite him agreeing this was an issue in the area.

I therefore suggested some draft conditions to added to the operating schedule to promote the licensing objectives.

Mr Aziz agreed to some of the suggested conditions however felt some were unfair and is not willing to accept them as conditions of the licence.

I did discuss this with him on the telephone and he suggested an alternative condition was but I do not feel under the circumstances this would go far enough to prevent such alcohol being sold to customers with the intention of drinking in the public spaces surrounding the premises.

As we are unable to reach a compromise which gives the police satisfaction that the licensing objectives will not be undermined the representation is in accordance with section 18 (3) and (4) of the Licensing act 2003.

A further bundle of supporting evidence for the grounds of this objection will follow.

I am a Licensing Enforcement Officer for the South Division of Derbyshire Constabulary and I am currently stationed at St Marys Wharf Police Station.

I am part of the team responsible for dealing with licensed premises and all matters under the Licensing Act 2003 on behalf of Derbyshire Constabulary. I have been with this department for over five years and my main responsibility is for the areas surrounding Derby City Centre which includes Normanton, Abbey and Rose Hill neighbourhood wards.

A premises licence application for Fresh Oshee Supermarket, 166 Normanton Road, Derby DE23 6UX was received by Derbyshire Constabulary on Monday 2nd August 2021. The applicant Mr Barham Aziz, who is also appointed as the Designated Premises Supervisor, has applied for a new premises licence, to allow the supply of alcohol from 0600 – 0000, seven days a week.

The premises location is on Normanton Road, Derby which forms part of the South Division police area and is within the Derby City Council area.

The circumstances leading to this objection are as follows;

Upon receiving the application I had concerns about the area in which it was located, due to my policing knowledge is an area of Derby which is frequented by street drinkers who regular cause nuisance and anti-social behaviour making the lives of residents, visitors and business owners very difficult. I contacted my Aziz on the telephone and sent an email asking him to contact me so I would discuss the application further.

I then had email correspondence with Mr Aziz and advised him that the location on the new licence was situated in an area of Derby where this a high volume of anti – social behaviour and street drinking and therefore in order to promote the licensing objectives I sent him some proposed conditions to be added to the operating schedule.

A response was received from Mr Aziz and he acknowledged the issue of street drinking in the surrounding area however he was wanted to discuss three of the conditions from the proposed list I had sent.

The three conditions were;

- 13. No super strength beer, lager or cider of 6.5% ABV (alcohol by volume) or above shall be sold at the premises.**
- 14. Any lager and cider will not be sold in single cans or bottles**
- 15. Any alcohol sold at the premises must have a price sticker or mark identifying the premises it has been sold from.**

On Tuesday 3rd August 2021 I had a telephone conversation with the applicant regarding the conditions and the fact that he felt they were unfair. He suggested an alternative condition to replace the last three which would be

super strength beer, lager or cider of 6.5% ABV (alcohol by volume) will be kept behind the counter.

I then informed Mr Aziz after consideration that the proposed alternative conditions did not go far enough to satisfy the police that the licensing objectives would be promoted and therefore if we could not agree I would have no choice but to submit an objection the granting of the premises licence.

Street drinking is essentially a group of individuals, many with alcohol dependency, gathering in an area for a common purpose, which is consuming alcohol to get intoxicated. Once intoxicated street drinkers then go on to commit crime and disorder, anti-social and intimidating behaviour towards residents, workers and visitors in the area.

Street drinking and associated anti-social behaviour can impact on people's perception of the physical environment and more importantly their quality of life and safety. Groups of drinkers can sometimes stop people using public spaces. Throughout this statement I will use the phrase "street drinking" or "street drinkers"

Derbyshire Constabulary currently records all incidents and calls for service reported on the control works system. I have searched for incidents recorded within a 150 metre radius of the new licence location from 30th of April 2021.

This list I have attached to the bundle as appendix 2.

In preparing this summary I have looked at incidents involving "street drinkers" and anti-social behaviour in an effort to quantify the scale of the problem in the area.

The vast majority of the incidents have been reported by members of the public that live and work in the vicinity. On the whole the incidents appeared to be alcohol fuelled and it is apparent that the persons reporting the incidents are implying this an on-going, regular issue which has been happening for some time.

There are other incidents or crime and disorder which but for the purpose of this bundle I have tried to highlight only the ones directly linked to public drunkenness, nuisance and anti-social behaviour incidents.

The applicant, Mr Aziz has not disputed the issue of street drinking in the area however has failed to address this on the operating schedule upon submission of the application.

Please refer to the statement of Inspector Keith Chambers who is responsible for Pear Tree Police station also known as Derby West.

I have included his statement in the evidential bundle as appendix 3.

His statement was submitted during the application for a PSPO (public space protection order) and it gives a clear indication of the scale of the problem with street drinking.

To quote Inspector Chambers "Street drinking is a major issue and concern for the area, not only the impact on the wider public but that of the health of individuals concerned"

Derbyshire Police and Derby City Council operatives are often called to the area to incidents involving street drinkers and a large proportion of time and effort is spent trying to find a solution to the problem. One of the frustrations faced is the fact that it is obvious high strength alcohol has been purchased in the area but it is a difficult, if not impossible task to locate the exact source. I feel the only solution to this is to have some sort of marker or label on the alcohol vessels to identify the seller. This would allow premises to be given the appropriate advice and support.

The issues are also reported in the local news and unfortunately provide a very grim picture of the area. There are a large number of residents, business owners and visitors to the area who are subjected to such unpleasant activities and their local area is depicted in such a negative light.

I have attached a few articles from the Derby Telegraph under appendix 4.

Again, I refer to the statement of Inspector Chambers (appendix 3) who has included a quote "The main passage through the area from Derby City centre is Normanton Road which then leads onto Pear Tree Road, these streets consist of a high volume of off-licensed premises which retail strong liquors, Beers and Ciders. There is no doubt the area is saturated with these types of businesses, all the surrounding streets on both sides also have these types of premises"

I have completed some research from our Innkeeper System which is used to record the details of all premises licences. I have only included in my search "off licences", which are "live" and ones with a current Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS) recorded. There were however a number of other "live licences" but as they do not have a current DPS they cannot operate at this time however this is subject to change. In the interest of fairness, I have only included licences in my search that can currently operate. Within 0.5 miles or less to 166 Normanton Road, Derby there are 19 separate premises licences which are currently live on our system. This is a high number and clearly shows the high level of saturation from "off licences" in the Normanton area.

I have attached details of these premises to the bundle as appendix 5.

It has come to light since my earlier dealings with Mr Aziz that he is already a Licence Holder and Designated Premises Supervisor at a neighbouring premises, namely Europa Delikatesy. 170 Normanton Road, Derby after a transfer took place on 04/03/2019.

This premises has been visited by another Licensing Enforcement Officer for Derbyshire Constabulary, PC Gareth Fowler and a Peartree Officer, PC Sutton on 23/09/2020. This was part of planned visits to licenced premises following complaints of street drinkers in the area.

The Officers discovered that the premises licence was not being adhered to due to the CCTV not reordering for the correct amount of days and the challenge 21 scheme not being followed.

I have attached a copy of the letter PC Fowler sent in follow up and the Infringement notice issued to the Designated Premises Supervisor. This will be appendix 6.

I have included a map indicating the location of the new premises and its close proximity to Grove Street Carpark which is currently being reported as a hive of activity for street drinkers, drug takers and homeless to gather. This carpark is literally only metres away from 166 Normanton road. This item can be found in appendix 7. I have also included a photo (appendix 8) this was taken from Grove Street Carpark which shows the new premises is only on the opposite side of the road.

Mr Aziz already holds a premises licence in the immediate area which does not restrict the sale of high strength beer and cider. His only argument for not restricting the sale at his new premises is that there is a requirement for it within his community. However, I would argue this is excessive and the likelihood of high strength alcohol being obtained by the street drinking fraternity and those intent on getting publicly intoxicated far out ways this argument.

Mr Aziz has offered no real alternative to satisfy my concerns apart from keeping high strength beer and cider behind the counter.

In my professional opinion this is likely, in itself to lead to confrontation and the fact the alcohol is for sale will lead to attempted sales which would have to be refused by staff at the premises. This could lead to confrontation and possible crime and disorder and will put pressure on staff at the premises who essentially have to profile customers for every sale.

I would also like to draw attention to the visit to the Europa Delikatesy by PC Fowler and the fact that an age verification policy was not being adhered to and no records of staff training have been provided to

the police since. Therefore, the Police has little confidence in the fact the Licence Holder will adhere to this and train staff accordingly.

People who participate in street drinking mostly have some sort of alcohol dependency and have limited funds available to purchase alcohol and on some occasions their income comes from begging.

Therefore, they are looking to purchase as higher strength alcohol possible, in single units. Which is why lager and cider are preferred over spirits which are above their price point.

The position of the Police is that we have little confidence, that without conditions imposed conditions on the licence this new licensed premises will add to the already existing impact taking place on the local community. There is already an abundance of high strength beer and cider available for purchase in the immediate area, including from a premises a few metres away which is already run by the licence holder. The Police feel that without the appropriate conditions adding to the licence the licensing objectives will be undermined.

The local residents and business owners in the area are reporting how the issues with street drinkers are adversely impacting their lives, which is constantly being tackled by the Police and Local Authority.

I would respectfully ask the Licensing Sub Committee to take the evidence provided into consideration and the police objection as relevant.

Hello Mr Aziz,

After our discussion on the telephone last week I have considered the proposed alternative with regards to the conditions.

Unfortunately I am still of the opinion that a revised condition 'to keep high strength alcohol behind the counter' would not go far enough to promote this licensing objectives.

In this case I have taken into consideration the complaints and issues of ASB which are already taking place in the area and the amount of premises already in the location where alcohol is available. Also the fact the premises you are also DPS/PLH for (170 Normanton Road) was visited by a Licensing Officer, Pc Fowler on 23/09/2020 and issued an infringement notice for not being compliant with the conditions of that premises licence.

I have also considered the points you have raised regarding members of the community wishing to purchase higher strength alcohol, however with all the other factors involved in this application I cannot be satisfied the steps you are proposing will be enough.

Therefore I would still be requesting the original conditions I sent below be added to the licence. Obviously you are under no obligation to accept them, however I must tell you that the only alternative the police can consider would be objecting to the granting of the premises licence. This would allow a hearing to take place so we can request adequate conditions are added to the licence.

I know this will not be the news you wish to hear but our role as responsible authority is to ensure that the licensing objectives are being promoted particularly in respect of crime and disorder.

I am still happy to visit your premises and speak to you further regarding this, however I must tell you my position will unfortunately remain the same.

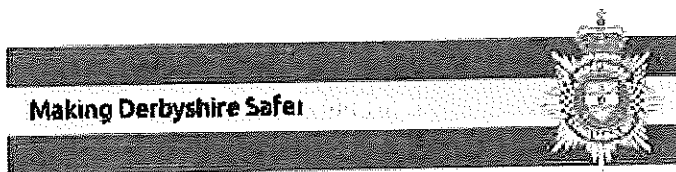

Unfortunately I will be unable to call today at 1430 hours as requested. However I can explain over email the reason I need to speak to you.

The application submitted is an area of Derby where we are having regular issues with street drinking and anti-social behaviour. In order to promote the licensing objectives I have provided some draft

proposed conditions to add to the licence.

Please read these conditions carefully and let me know if there are any issues. If we can agree to add the suitable, enforceable conditions there will be no objection to the granting of the premises licence.

Please reply to the email if you are in agreement with the conditions or if you wish to negotiate on them.

Proposed Conditions for 166a Normanton Road, Derby

1. Full training is provided to all staff on commencement of employment on the sale of age-restricted products sold and any system or procedures they are expected to follow in the course of dealing with these goods. Refresher training should be provided at regular intervals (at least 6 monthly).
2. Records detailing the training provided will be kept on the premises for production, on request, to an officer of a Responsible Authority under the licensing act 2003. Records shall be retained on the premises for a minimum of 12 months.
3. A 'Challenge 25' Proof of Age scheme will be operated. Anyone attempting to purchase alcohol (or other min. 18 restricted product) that appears under the age of 25 years will be asked for proof of age. Acceptable forms of identification will be a PASS-accredited proof of age card, photo driving licence or passport. Failure to produce satisfactory proof of age will result in a refused sale.
4. Clear, prominent and unobstructed signage informing customers of the Proof of Age scheme in operation and the age restrictions on products, will be clearly displayed at:
 - all entry points to the premises,
 - adjacent to the products, where displayed,
 - all points of sale
5. A refusal record will be kept on the premises for production, on request, to an officer of a Responsible Authority under the licensing act 2003. Records shall be retained on the premises for a minimum of 12 months.
 - The basis for the refusal
 - The person making the decision to make the decision to refuse;
 - The date and time of the refusal
6. A CCTV system will be installed and maintained at the premises. The CCTV system will be recording at all times when the premises are open for licensable activities and cover all areas to which the public have access.
7. The system shall be maintained in good working order and be of evidential quality and produce good quality images in all lighting conditions.
8. All CCTV recordings must be retained for a minimum of 28 days. These images must be available for viewing at any reasonable time upon request of a Police officer or other authorised person of a responsible authority under the licensing act 2003, and in accordance with the requirements of Data Protection legislation.
9. The Premise Licence Holder, DPS and other designated members of staff must be able to retrieve and copy any recording/images at the time of asking or within 48 hours if so required (The police will not meet the cost for a recording or materials used for a reproduction of the image in respect of any crime or disorder, all costs are to be met by the owner of the system. If the incident is unrelated to the premises, the retrieval, if a cost incurred, would be met

between the agencies requiring the image).

10. *Access to the CCTV recording unit must be kept locked, to be accessed only by the Designated Premises Supervisor or duty manager.*
11. *A suitable Incident/accident book shall be kept to record all instances of disorder, damage to property and personal injury at the premises. This book shall be made available for inspection and copying by the police and other officers of Responsible Authorities under the licensing act 2003, immediately upon request and all such books shall be retained at the premises for at least 12 months.*
12. *Notices will be displayed at the exits to the premises asking customers to leave quietly and respect the local community.*
13. *No super strength beer, lager or cider of 6.5% ABV (alcohol by volume) or above shall be sold at the premises.*
14. *Any lager and cider will not be sold in single cans or bottles*
15. *Any alcohol sold at the premises must have a price sticker or mark identifying the premises it has been sold from.*

I am a police Inspector for Derbyshire Constabulary and I am approaching twenty-one years' service, at present I am currently serving at Pear Tree police station also known as Derby West. I have worked in this area for the last thirteen years, ten of which have been as an operational Sergeant.

The area is made up of several wards, Normanton, Rosehill, Littleover, Mickleover and Abbey, they are very different in their make up and all present different problems. Normanton and Rosehill are inner city areas close to the City centre and contain the most diverse communities in the County with high deprivation rates.

In May 2019 I returned to Derby West as section Inspector, one of the teams under my control is the Normanton & Rosehill safer neighbourhood team, their role is to tackle local issues and offer reassurance through high visibility patrols and community engagement.

The team engage with the community and have set priorities which are formulated by the public, at present ours are as follows:

- Street drinking
- Anti-Social behaviour
- Drug use and supply
- Street sex workers
- Serious and Acquisitive crime
- Covid compliance

The Normanton & Rosehill area of the City is without doubt the most diverse and complex within the County. It houses a rich mix of ethnicity, cultures and religions and an ever-growing emerging transient community from Eastern Europe. This brings many issues and problems which have existed for some time, the area is also widely known to be in within the bottom four per cent in the Country for social deprivation.

The main passage through the area from Derby City centre is Normanton Road which then leads onto Pear Tree Road, these streets consist of a high volume of off-licensed premises which retail strong liquors, Beers and Ciders. There is no doubt the area is saturated with these types of businesses, all the surrounding streets on both sides also have these types of premises. Many of these are run by Eastern Europeans and Iraqi / Afghan Kurds and are known to sell dangerous contraband alcohol and Cigarette's which can have a serious detrimental effect to a person's health.

Street drinking is a major issue and concern for the area, not only the impact on the wider public but that of the health of individuals concerned. In previous years my officers have tackled this issue through the dispersal of persons from the area building up an intelligence picture and then moving up the ladder to apply for criminal behavioural orders through the courts upon convictions for other offences, this has been more difficult in recent times due to court time and other procedural issues.

With the problem of street drinking comes other issues, males and females will openly urinate and defecate in the streets, residents complain of alleys at the rear of their properties with human excrement on the floor where their children pass. All this takes place in broad daylight in full view of the public, this cause's further issues for police as this behaviour can grossly offend some of the religious culture that exists in the area. School children view this behaviour from bus stops on their way to school and moving vehicles as they pass by.

The media interest in street drinking is high and is also considered a problem in other Cities across the country, this has the added problem now of widely available drugs known as Mamba or synthetic cannabinoids. Anti-social behaviour all across four corners of the area exists, we are fully aware of the prevalence of this problem across the area, the issues are difficult to control when one place is identified as a hot spot or popular place to meet and drink it simply moves on to other spots. These can be anywhere either residential or commercial and bring with them the same problems of urinating and defecation, more isolated areas now suffer from this rather than just the main passage through.

Fly tipping in the area is a major concern and again is quite rightly highlighted by media coverage and the emergence of local groups of residents set up to challenge people who commit this type of environmental crime. Whilst not linked to street drinking the disposal of litter can be linked and often identifies new drinking spots with the masses of empty discarded cans. When this happens other rubbish and much more larger items will then appear such as beds, mattresses, old furniture and broken television sets, almost like a call to discard unwanted rubbish at these very locations. A local group have also taken this issue to heart, The Normanton Empowerment Team are a team of volunteers who regularly clean the streets and highlight to people what they should do with their rubbish. The City has been subject of a National documentary on Channel 5 in the past on this emotive issue and they continue to gain public support through local media and social media strands.

Anti-Social behaviour in the area has always been a long-term issue, however I firmly believe this is a little more unique as this concerns both adults and juveniles. We have worked alongside our partner agencies and put various things in place to divert this away as best as possible, however with cuts to most public sectors over the last three years this has become difficult to keep on top of and in turn further stretches resources.

The issue of ASB seems to be an ever-increasing problem and concern to local residents and happens widespread over the area rather than in just one place. Adult unemployed males will gather along Normanton Road, Lowerdale Road, Princess Street, Clarence Road to name but a few and conduct themselves in a manner which causes annoyance to the community, this is a social issue and is diverse in it's make up. It is a daily occurrence where groups of unemployed men frequent street corners, open spaces and drink single purchased cans from off licences then involve themselves in anti-social behaviour.

This is not to mention the effect on our local parks, one of which is widely known as one of the first parks in the Country which has suffered with gangs of males selling drugs and people taking synthetic cannabinoids and stumbling around suffering from the effects of them all in full view of families. Drugs are widely available in the area despite some excellent work by local police and regional crime teams, when drug gangs are taken out this merely creates an opportunity for another to move in.

The problem of synthetic cannabinoids creates more issues as they are cheaper to purchase and seen as more recreational, when arrests are made the lead times for convictions are astronomical due to the forensic testing of the substance.

Many of the area's alleys and car parks show evidence of drug use, needles are discarded virtually anywhere, streets, to the rear of shops & houses, bushes and even behind electricity boxes and local focal points such as garden planters. Local adult sex workers also use some of these areas to conduct their business which also leaves masses of used condoms, in some of these areas the stench from urine and faeces is extremely unpleasant, deep street cleans are used often to address this concern.

The issue of street begging has evolved, this is a different style of begging to that of City Centres across the Country. Rather than sitting on the streets asking for money, the modus operandi here is to walk up and down the streets asking, this is harder to detect but affects and irritates more people and businesses in the process. We are aware of major displacement from City Centre beggars but we also have local Eastern Europeans and travelling groups coming to the area to beg.

The Muslim community are at this time deeply offended by the behaviour of what is perceived to be the homeless community, local Mosques now give out messages at Friday prayers not to give to beggars as they are affecting the area. It is obvious that some see these as homeless and due to their faith take pity on them and part with money, making the area attractive to this type of activity.

The area has four parks and many other green areas with various children's play equipment on, these attract people with dogs and with the exception of The Arboretum park are littered with dog waste. The local streets also suffer from this issue with a seemingly uncaring attitude from dog owners to collect their waste. It is also not uncommon for many of the areas undesirables to use dogs to intimidate other locals and often police officers so that they can go about their illicit business with little fear. To be able to use the relevant powers in the proposal would greatly assist the police, rangers and police community support officers to enhance the area and more importantly our local parks.

The local Policing team are fully committed to providing the best service that we can and we constantly struggle with the issue of displacement. Often a problem is solved and it simply moves to a different location. Our community are transient and will often return back to the country of their origin and simply return later to continue with their behaviour. It is frustrating not having sufficient powers to tackle a modern-day problem.

Public Space Protection Order (PSPO) Consultation FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What is a Public Space Protection Order (PSPO)?

A Public Space Protection Order (PSPO) is a power under the Anti-Social Behaviour, Crime and Policing Act 2014. They are intended to allow a Council to deal with a particular nuisance or problem behaviour that is detrimental to the local community's quality of life in a particular area. They allow Councils to impose either restrictions or requirements in that particular area that will apply to everyone. They are designed to ensure the law-abiding majority can use and enjoy public spaces safe from anti-social behaviour.

Why do we need a PSPO in Derby?

Both ourselves and our partners have identified that there are a number of issues within the city centre and the neighbouring areas that are having a negative impact on people who live, work or visit the city. There have been a significant number of complaints made to the police and the Council around the issues of public safety and nuisance as well as the issues that the Council and partners regularly witness. Many of these issues relate to anti-social behaviour linked to alcohol and drugs.

What would the changes be if we had PSPOs?

PSPOs allow us and partners to directly address a broader range of anti-social behaviours rather than those just associated with the misuse of alcohol. The proposed conditions support our vibrant city and neighbourhoods whilst setting boundaries of what are regarded as unacceptable behaviours.

What are the proposed conditions?

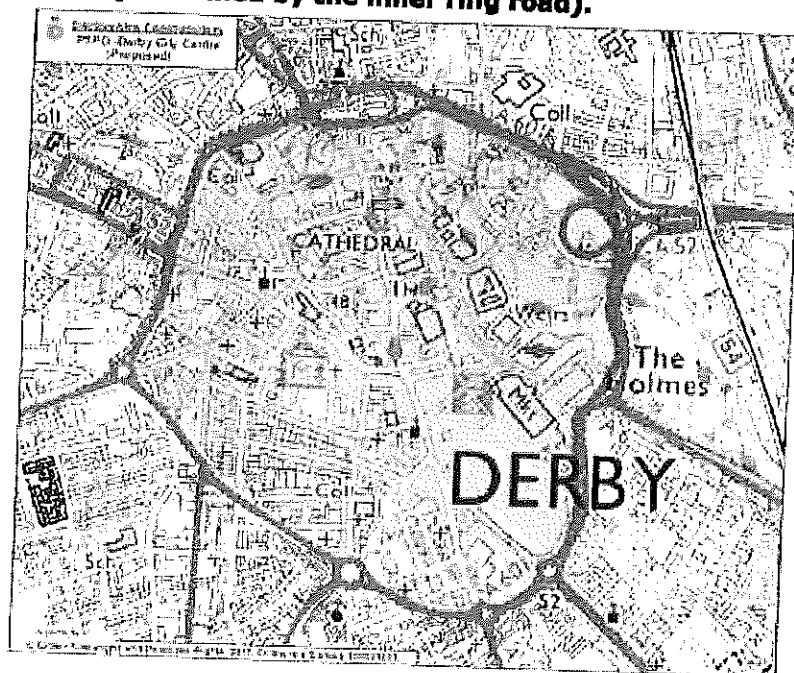
The proposed conditions are as follows:-

1. No person shall ingest, inhale, inject, smoke or otherwise use intoxicating substances in a public place, excluding alcohol, tobacco or prescription medicines. Intoxicating substances are psychoactive substances with the capacity to stimulate or depress a person's central nervous system and are referred to as New Psychoactive Substances (NPS).
2. No person shall beg (using either active or passive methods of obtaining alms) or ask members of the public for money in a public place.
3. No person shall consume alcohol in a public place (excluding licensed premises) in a manner which causes a nuisance or annoyance to other persons in the locality.
4. No person shall urinate or defecate in a public place (excluding public toilets).
5. No person shall loiter in a public place, either as an individual or in a group, if they are causing or likely to cause anti-social behaviour. If asked to disperse by a Police Constable, PCSO or an authorised officer of the Council, that person must not return to the public place for a period of 24 hours.

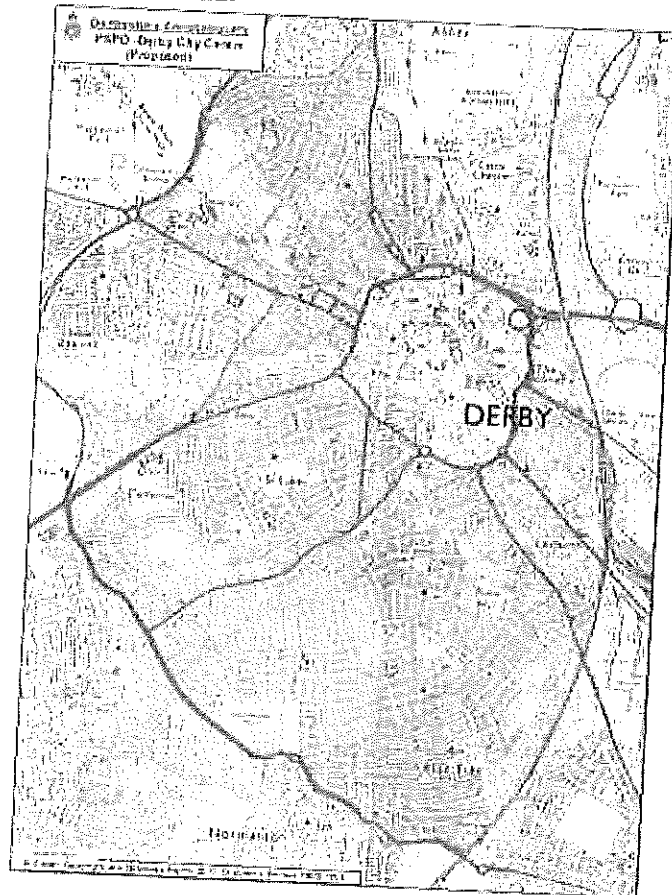
What area would the PSPO cover?

There are two proposed PSPOs covering two areas defined below.

Area 1: The city centre (as defined by the Inner ring road).



Area 2: The outer zone including some areas of Strutts Park, Castleward, Normanton, Abbey, Stockbrook and the area surrounding Kedleston road.



What would happen if I breached it?

Breaching a PSPO is a criminal offence. Orders can be enforced by an officer authorised by the local authority including PCSOs and a Police Constable. A breach of the PSPO can be dealt with through the issuing of a Fixed Penalty Notice of up to £100 or by prosecution.

Disgusted residents putting
down sawdust in Normanton
to clean sick, urine and
faeces left by druggies and
drinkers



'The smell makes us sick. It's disgusting. The car park is used as a toilet'

Disgusted residents are having to put down sawdust to clean up sick, urine and faeces left by drug users and street drinkers outside their homes in a Derby street.

They say Grove Street car park, off Normanton Road, has become a "magnet for filth" caused by people drinking alcohol in the car park and openly taking drugs.

Police say they are aware of issues in the area and have arrested and dispersed offenders.

One tearful resident, who contacted Derbyshire Live and did not want to give her name, said living in the area was "awful".

The woman, who lives in Grove Street, said: "Grove Street car park is a hellhole. I hate where I live. There are huge problems with people getting out of their heads on alcohol and drugs. It's horrendous.

"Every single day me and other residents are having to put sawdust outside our homes to cover up their mess. The smell makes us sick. It's disgusting. The car park is used as a toilet.

"We can't open our windows in this boiling weather because of the flies their mess attracts. It's making our lives a nightmare. I've been in contact with the police and the council about the issues.

"It's upsetting living here. Nobody should have to put sawdust outside their homes to clear up the mess of other human beings. It's a magnet for filth."

The woman, who has lived in the area for a number of years, said she has sympathy for the street drinkers and drug addicts but is outraged at how it has impacted her life.

She added: "I know this area is not perfect. I do feel sorry for these people. Clearly their lives have got very bad for them to be in this situation where they have to use the streets as a toilet and have to drink and take drugs openly.

"But it's not fair on us. We shouldn't have to put up with this. I do see police in the area and they do deal with them and move them on. But there is a big group of them, there's different people here all the time as well.

"Sometimes it's two people on the car park causing problems, other times there are 25 people there."

Michelle Smith, who also lives on Grove Street, said she wanted to move. She added: "It's right outside our door. Your home is where you're supposed to feel good. I'm not scared of them. But I shouldn't have to put up with seeing them causing big problems."

Sergeant Donna Abbott, the police officer responsible for the Safer Neighbourhoods Team in Rosehill and Normanton, said: "My officers have been conducting regular patrols in the area and people have been dispersed and, where necessary, arrests have been made.

"The increase in numbers could have been as a result of a number of old sofas being left on the grass verge of the car park.

"These sofas appear to have attracted more people than usual as it gave them a place to sit in the sun and drink.

"We requested that these sofas were removed by the council and this has now been done.

"Should further issues continue in this location I would urge the community to keep reporting the matter to us. We want to work with residents to make the area a nice, safe environment in which to live.

"I will liaise with Derby City Council's Streetpride team in relation to the mess that has been left behind."

New CCTV cameras to catch Derby's drunks and street urinator



Police have issued a stern warning that they are "looking out for you" after installing new CCTV cameras in a Derby suburb following weeks of trouble. New cameras are in place around Normanton in response to recent problems with anti-social behaviour - including littering and, more disturbingly, urinating. The cameras, installed by the police on street light poles, are at Walbrook Road car park near to the roundabout junction with Stenson Road.

As well as cameras, police have also revealed new lighting has also been fitted around the Normanton area - especially in places deemed to be in anti-social behaviour hotspots.

Traders around the area said the mess seen around the car park was at times "beyond belief" and had gone on for "far too long".

The Safer Neighbourhood Team in Normanton issued this warning on Twitter: "Looking out for you!

"CCTV cameras installed around Normanton. Combating anti-social behaviour and nuisance (littering, drunkenness, urinating and more), ensuring people can use the public space safely and providing evidence and reassurance."

News of the new CCTV presence has been welcomed.

Jack Gill, who runs Gills Store on Walbrook Road said: "I'm glad there is some CCTV there now. There's always people drinking and loitering around there.

"It's been going on for far too long - I have to say it's beyond belief at times really what you see left there. "

Shursh Ahmed who runs the nearby shop Market Groszek added: "To be honest I've only just seen it but I can understand why because of the litter. Sometimes it is quite bad.

"I think the police came in the shop once and was asking my colleague about the state of the car park. So it has been reported before."

Sergeant Ben Frearson, from the Normanton safer neighbourhood team, said: "Following ongoing reports of anti-social behaviour, street drinking and littering in the area around the Walbrook Road car park the local policing team has put in place a mobile CCTV camera.

"As well as the camera, officers have also been working with neighbourhood officers from Derby City Council to help keep the area clean, along with new lighting being fitted.

"If you are concerned about similar issues in your area please contact your local policing team."

Residents outraged over the state of Derby's filthiest car park

Residents say that the car park is a hotbed of crime

A car park in Derby has been branded "a nightmare" by residents as their back gardens look out onto rubbish, used needles, and faeces.

Charlotte Street car park which sits directly behind Church Street, In Normanton, is a hotspot for flytipping as well as drugs and prostitution, residents say.

Church Street complainants did not wish to be named but one even sent Derbyshire Live CCTV footage of a man defecating directly outside his home.

He said: "I have lived here for 27 years, so all of my life. The car park has been this way for, I would say, seven years.

"My childhood memory is that it has always been a car park, it has just never been as bad as it is now.

"The problem that we are having is that a lot of people are coming over to fly-tip, a lot of businesses and there are a lot of people who are coming from near Charlotte Street just to fly-tip.

"There's no spotlights at night time so it is literally pitch black.

"There's a problem [with] prostitution, in literally broad daylight you will see a woman will be lying on the floor and obviously you know what's happening."

Another issue, the resident said is the location's proximity to shops selling alcohol which he says encourages day drinking.

"What we are getting is, a lot of people going there to buy alcohol and they are literally drinking all day. Then another issue that we are having is that when they have been drinking in excess, they are urinating in broad daylight on the side of my property, and, believe it or not, I have seen three or four people do a number two."

One local said that everyone should take a stand, describing Normanton as a fantastic multicultural area that needs to be kept clean.

Another resident said that she can no longer open her back gate because of the amount of rubbish blocking it.

She said: "There is drugs, drinking alcohol, and three or four ladies and men lying down. I don't know, it is too much [of a] problem.

"I am worried because I have children and my husband is sick."

Derbyshire Live reported on the state of Charlotte Street car park in 2018 when there was a fly-tipping problem.

Signs have been put up around the car park by Derby City Council say: "We are watching you - you are at risk of a Penalty Charge Notice".

Residents say that drug usage is also a problem in the area. Derby City Council sent workers to the site last week (Wednesday, September 1) to "cleanse" the area.

A resident said: "There was a guy from the Council who has come to clean up the needles and I asked him how many needles he'd recovered and he said 96."

Mohammed Fraz, from Mirpur Jewellers on Pear Tree Road told Derbyshire Live:

"It's just trashy isn't it? It's just really trashy and unhealthy. I have been here seven years and I have just seen it get worse and worse.

"I've stopped bothering about it because you can't do much about it to be fair. You don't want to get into any conflict or anything."

Residents say that businesses regularly dump rubbish at the site.

They say that the blame lies with Derby City Council and Derbyshire police.

A resident said: "There needs to be tougher action in terms of the police doing their jobs and giving out fines and literally making a deterrent.

"The council needs to put money aside for the car park in terms of renovating it, doing something with the area and they really need to have a look at the licenses of the businesses in the area.

"I've rang the police, I have about five pages worth of reference numbers. The police did patrol the area for four days but that's it.

"They are not issuing on-the-spot fines. A lad the other day who was caught urinating by police, they never gave him a warning, never gave him a fine. They just spoke to him."

Another resident said: "Obviously we do tell the council and the council are helpful at times and not helpful at times either. It's all about the funding."

Residents have thought about leaving the area but said that this would not fix the situation.

"Honestly, most of the people that live here, they're all trying to move out of the area," a resident said.

A Derby City Council spokesperson said: "We are aware of a number issues within Charlotte Street car park which includes anti-social behaviour, littering and fly-tipping and are working to combat them.

"A full cleanse of the car park was carried out [on Wednesday, September 1] to remove the litter and waste and we continue to explore ways to reduce the litter and fly-tipping in the vicinity.

"Our Public Protection Team regularly patrol the car park and a number of Fixed Penalty Notices have been issued relating to fly-tipping offences.

"We are also working in partnership with Derbyshire Police and other key stakeholders to improve the safety and cleanliness of the area."

Inspector Keith Chambers said: "This car park has posed a problem for some time because it isn't well-lit and its position is relatively out of public view.

"However, we have been working to tackle issues at Charlotte Street to improve the situation.

"Local police officers continue to work with the city council to address concerns around fly tipping, which has always been the main issue at this location.

"Officers regularly patrol the area to deal with anti-social behaviour and over the last three months, we have deployed a CCTV camera.

"Several people found urinating in the area have been prosecuted and over the last year, we have made several arrests in relation to drug use and drug supply.

"Charlotte Street is not regularly used for prostitution, but we accept that a low number of instances could be occurring and we address this with regular patrols.

"We will always act on information provided to us by the community and I would urge residents to continue to work with us to improve the situation.

"We are also working with our partners to address some concerns around the layout of the area. Several proposals are being considered which would have a major impact on the issues we currently face."

Licensing Visit – Europa Delikatessy

As the Designated Premises Supervisor for the above premises I must bring the following to your attention.

On Wednesday 23 September 2020 I attended your premises in my capacity as a Police Licensing Enforcement Officer. At the time of my attendance the premises were open to the public and licensable activities were available and ongoing. Whilst at the premises I carried out a Licensing inspection with regards to the issued authorising premises licence and also gave Malgorzata IWANICKA advice regarding your responsibilities as a DPS in regards to promoting the four Licensing Objectives and compliance with and adherence to the conditions attached to the Premises Licence.

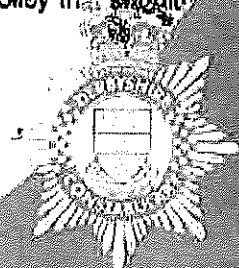
As a result of my visit I would like to draw your attention to your Premises Licence – Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the operating schedule.

- 2) The system will keep all recorded images for a period as specified within the Police Crime Reduction Officer's recommendations, or for a period of no less than fourteen days.

The above condition is in regards to your CCTV system. The CCTV system appears to out by 24 hours as the system was showing as being live on 24/09/20. Also there were only 7 days shown as being recorded with the system appearing to have not been recording over the weekend just gone. This is clearly breaching the 14 day requirement in the above condition.

- 4) A 'Challenge 21 Scheme' will be operated by the premises and all staff employed at the premises will be trained on the use and operation of the scheme.

On speaking with Malgorzata and another member of staff present, both believed that they should be checking people who appear to be under the age of 18 for ID when they are attempting to purchase alcohol. They did not know about the challenge 21 policy that should be in place and being utilised.



I was unable to view any training that has taken place to ensure that the above condition is implemented. If such training exists please forward it to me by return so that it can be inspected.

I would remind you that failure to comply with the conditions on the licence could lead to a review under Section 51 of the Licensing Act 2003 and to the prosecution of any offences disclosed. Unauthorised Licenseable activities can carry a maximum penalty of 6 months imprisonment and/or an unlimited fine.

Further to this Part B of your premises licence was not displayed correctly, both A4 Sheets of this part of the Premises Licence need to be on display, in a clear and prominent position. Failure to do this can draw a fine of up to £500. Further to this, the full premises licence was produced but I believe this to be an unauthorised copy. I have drawn this conclusion as part of part A of the licence has been copied onto the rear of part B. Legislation states that the original or certified copy must be kept on the premises for production on request of an authorised officer.

I Would urge that you to remedy these breaches immediately and certainly before you carry out any further licenseable activities. Further to this, please could you contact me as soon as possible to arrange a date for a further visit to ensure that you are compliant with your issued premises licence.

I will cause a copy of this letter to be forwarded to the Licensing Authority at Derby City Council for their information.

If there is any help or assistance that you require in becoming compliant with your premises licence or any other Licensing related matters, then please do not hesitate to get in touch.
