2. The processing of 61 planning applications	To avoid duplication of effort, to make use of the internal/Ombudsman inquiry/reviews when reported. While it was agreed on 15 June that an initial update be brought to this meeting, 27 July, the timetabling of meetings mean this is premature as the report is to be considered first by the Planning Control Committee on 30 July. This should therefore be considered in September.	
3. Derbyroads	To receive a six month update on 27 July. On this agenda	
4. Kedleston Road Bus Lane	'Light touch' scrutiny of the proposals and response to the public consultation on 27 July. On this agenda.	
5. Neighbourhood Boards/H&T interface.	To take forward the 8 proposals in 'Engaging Communities, Meeting Expectations: Highways & Transport and Neighbourhood Boards'. To be undertaken by Chair, Vice Chair and an LD nominee working with the H&T Division, Neighbourhood Team and CSP to produce a draft Protocol making Neighbourhood Boards more central in decision making and enhancing the role of Neighbourhood Managers. As a prelude, the co-ordination officer hold an initial meeting with whole Neighbourhood Manager Team. See agenda item 12 for an update
