

ADULT LEARNING PLAN 2003-04

Report of the Director of Education

SUMMARY OF REPORT

- 1.1 The Adult Learning Plan (ALP) is the Plan against which the Adult Learning Service receives Adult Community Learning Funding (ACL) from the Learning and Skills Council (LSC). The funding was previously known as the Block Grant and supports non-qualification activity within the Adult Learning Service (ALS).
- 1.2 The Plan covers priorities and activities for the Service in the coming year, and is linked to wider Council strategies and to a range of partners (Appendix 1).

OPTION CONSIDERED

2. In order to secure its core funding for the year the Adult Learning Service is required to submit this plan to the Learning and Skills Council for approval by the Secretary of State.

RECOMMENDATION

3. To endorse the draft ALP for submission to the LSC and approval by the Council as part of the policy framework, subject to final details being added by the Director of Education, in consultation with the Cabinet Member for Lifelong Learning.

REASON FOR RECOMMENDATION

4. The ALP must be submitted to the LSC by the deadline of 31 March 2003. The LSC accepts that in some local authorities approval by the Council may need to be confirmed after the submission date.

MATTER FOR CONSIDERATION

- 5.1 The ALP secures for the City Council Adult Community Learning (ACL) funding for the 2003-04 year.
- 5.2 The plan identifies the ALS priorities for development during the year.
- 5.3 The most important areas of the plan, covering priorities and activities to deliver them, are attached as Appendix 1. This draft is subject to further work on the detail. The plan can be accessed electronically at <http://172.16.1.41/locdem/meetings/meetingadmin/Mdisplay.asp?refnum=368>
- 5.4 The ALP is clearly linked to the Council's strategy for neighbourhood renewal and the priorities contained in the Corporate Plan and the Education Service Strategic Plan. It must also be linked to the LSC's Local Strategic Plan.
- 5.5 The ALP is required to show the organisations with which the Adult Learning Service works in partnership.
- 5.6 The LSC requires the Adult Learning Service to consult with partners and stakeholders on the Adult Learning Plan. Informal discussions with partners and stakeholders are taking place. A series of meetings have been arranged with the LSC and a formal consultation event will take place on 21 March 2003.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

- 6.1 The ALP will secure ACL funding during the 2003-04 financial year. This is the Adult Learning Service's major source of funding. The indicative allocation for the 2003-04 academic year is £1,588,144 subject to acceptance of this plan.
- 6.2 The following funding will also be secured subject to acceptance of this plan:
 - Minor works £53,635
 - Compliance to Special Education Needs (SEND) and Disability and Disability Discrimination (DDA) Acts £124,802
 - Management Information System (MIS) Infrastructure £40,000

LEGAL IMPLICATIONS

7. The ALP is a statutory plan under the Learning and Skills Act and is subject to approval by the Secretary of State.

PERSONNEL IMPLICATIONS

8. The work of the Adult Learning Service is guided by the priorities set out in the Plan.

ENVIRONMENTAL IMPLICATIONS

9. None directly arising from this report.

EQUALITIES IMPLICATIONS

10. High quality adult learning opportunities make a significant contribution to raising the achievement and prospects of young people and adults. Work under this plan is vital in addressing the Council's priority and the Education Service's Vision Statement of 'Success through Learning'.
