4. Details of association of the above premises with serious crime, serious disorder or both:

in the early hours of Sunday morning the 19<sup>th</sup> May 2019, the Police were made aware of a disturbance inside the premises known as D'Glos, Wardwick, Derby. It was apparent to the officers attending that a disturbance was occurring in the venue involving a large number of people. The crowd were both vocal and voistile and even with the police presence sporadic incidents of violence were breaking out. Not all the violence was serious however, the police officers responding to this incident were hindered significantly by the lack of co-operation from quatomers leaving the premises and becoming disorderly.

The disorder emanating from the premises and the perceived threat was so eignificant at this time that a large number of officers were called to the location for extra support to officers already present and actively involved in the incident.

The circumstances as so far known are as follows.

A fight broke out in the venue between three make, it seems the victim's father then also intervenes and punches are thrown causing the father to be knocked to the floor.

His son tries to make his escape but was pursed and caught by the two assellants who then continue to violently asseult him when comered.

It was at this time a member of staff alerted police that were stationed on the street outside the front doors.

Both the victims were seen by paramedics at the scene and then conveyed to the A&E at The Derby Royal Hospital.

The first male sustained a 5cm cut across the top of his head (the doctor states this could be consistent with a knife stash) he has pain to his neck and chest area, a broken jaw, a fractured eye socket and bruising around his body. He requires surgery to reconstruct his eye socket.

The other male has had a previous brain injury. He has a superficial cut to his head, possibly from hitting it when he fell after being punched. At this time he was talking to staff but is not cohesive. Hospital staffs are unaware at this stage if his demeanour is due to the injury sustained in this incident, or the existing brain injury or possibly just consumption of too much alcohol?

Initial reports from the officers attending this incident, would suggest that there was a lack of control within the premises; fights and disorder were allowed to take place unchecked. If earlier intervention by the door staff had challenged the people responsible, this incident may not have escalated and resulted in people sustaining serious injury.

The Premises Licence Holder and Designated Premises Supervisor of these premises are well aware that the view of the Police, has sively been that Responsible Authorities will always seek to support those involved in the management of licensed premises.

The Police Licensing Team have made strenuous efforts to support the premises over a number of years and it has been made clear that should any further serious incidents occur, positive action will be considered to ensure that the public is protected and they have confidence that the four licensing objectives are being promoted.

It is the view of the Police that this most recent incident has, on its own and taken cumulatively with other incidents, triggered an application for a summary review under Section 53A of the Licensing Act 2003.

The police have now lost all confidence that the management of D'Gios, at every level are capable of operating these premises in a way that promotes the four licensing objectives. Though it is based primarily on the incident above upon which the Chief Officer of Police makes this application, there will be presented to the Licensing Sub-Committee a full bundle of documents detailing other incidents and further avidence of Police action taken.

The Chief Officer of Police requests that the Licensing Authority uses its powers to suspend the licence until such times as a full review can be taken of all issues that have occurred at the premises and until such times as the Chief Officer of Police and the Licensing Authority can be reassured that the Licensing Objectives will be fully promoted.

At the present time therefore it is submitted that the only reasonable action upon review is one of requesting the consideration of revocation of the premises licence.

Whilst making this application I would set the panel to consider regulation 14 of the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations. I would request that the authority takes the view that the public interest in excluding the public from this hearing, out ways the public interest in the hearing, taking place in public.

I would sak that all members of the public are excluded at this time as any information disclosed may have a detrimental impact on any future court proceedings for offences being investigated.

To clarify, the police are bringing forward matters that are part of ongoing criminal investigations which could be prejudiced by public disclosure of the facts. Should information be disclosed this could jeopardise the outcome of the investigation as there may be further offenders yet to be identified.

When making this application and signing the attached certificate, I have considered the following:

The home office states that the test to determine the kinds of conduct that amounts to serious arims are set out in section 61 (2) and (3) (a) and (b) of the regulation of investigatory Powers Act 2000. Those tests are that the conduct:

- (a) Constitutes an offence for which a person who is 21 years of age or over with no previous convictions could reasonably be expected to be sentenced to imprisonment for 3 years or more:
- (b) Involves the use of violence, results in substantial financial gain or is conduct by a large number of persons in pursuit of a common purpose.

The offences being considered at this time are;

<u>Affray</u> — used or threatened unlawful violence towards another and your conduct was such as it would cause a person of reasonable firmness present at the scene to feer for his personal eafety contrary to Sect 3(1) and (7) Public Order Act 1986.

Max custodial sentence upon conviction - 3yrs imprisonment

#### Wound or inflict arievous bodily harm without intent

Contrary to Sect 20 Offences Against Person Act 1861

Max custodial sentence upon conviction - 5yrs imprisonment

Wound or inflict orievous bodily harm with Intent

Contrary to Sect 18 Offences Against Person Act 1881

Max custodial sentence upon conviction - Life imprisonment

I have also considered atternative powers in a way of addressing the issues but have found non suitable that would address our concerns, (Section 19 or section 51 of the Licensing Act 2003)

- 1. The Sub-Committee has considered an application for the review of a premises licence under section 53A of the Licensing Act 2003 (as amended) (premises associated with serious crime, serious disorder or both).
- The Sub-Committee has heard evidence from: Sandra Mansell Team Leader — Derby City Council (Licensing Team), Caroline Sellars, Solicitor & PC Mark Dunn (Derbyshire Constabulary) and Karen Cochrane, Solicitor, for the premises licence holder.

#### **DECISION**

- 3. In making its decision, the Sub-Committee has had regard to the Derby City Council Licensing Policy, the guidance issued under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 and the Human Rights Act 1998, and has carefully considered all the evidence presented to it.
- 4. The Sub-Committee has made this decision to promote the 4 licensing objectives namely:
  - (a) Prevention of crime and disorder:
  - (b) Public Safety;
  - (c) Prevention of Public Nuisance: and
  - (d) Protection of Children from harm.

#### 5. Findings

- 5.1 There was a valid application made by Derbyshire Constabulary by virtue of section 53A of the Licensing Act 2003, which was accompanied by a certificate issued by a superintendent of the constabulary in accordance with section 53A(1)(b) of the Licensing Act 2003, served within the correct time period to consider an expedited review.
- 5.2 The sub-committee has considered what constitutes serious crime under section 53A(4) of the Licensing Act 2003. The Sub-Committee is satisfied that taken together, the alleged offences under section 3(1) & (7) of the Public Order Act 1986 and sections 18 & 20 of the Offences Against the Person Act 1861 that have been identified by Derbyshire Constabulary, could reasonably be expected to attract a sentence of imprisonment for a term of three years or more.



- 5.3 There was no dispute between those representing Derbyshire Constabulary and those representing the premises licence holder that the events that took place (details of which next follow) were 'serious'.
- In the early hours of Sunday, 19 May 2019, serious crime and serious disorder took place at D'Gios, licensed premises within the city centre of Derby, one male was knocked to the floor suffering a superficial cut to his head sustained either from having been punched or upon hitting his head on floor. A second male, who had attempted to escape from the premises was also allegedly violently assaulted, sustaining a 5cm cut across the head which the sub-committee was told a doctor indicated was consistent with a knife slash. He also sustained a broken jaw, a fractured eye socket which will require reconstructive surgery, bruising around his body and with pain to his neck and chest areas. Both victims were attended at the premises by paramedics and were subsequently conveyed to the A & E department at Derby Royal Hospital.
- 5.4 Derbyshire Constabulary submits that effective management at the premises was lacking at the material time in that there was no effective control evident within the premises, that fights and disorder were allowed to take place unchecked and that effective earlier intervention by door supervisors would have averted the situation that eventually ensued as it would have deescalated the incident in which event the injuries sustained by the victims could have been avoided. Reference is made to previous incidents on a number of earlier occasions which the sub-committee notes but makes no particular findings on at this time.
- 5.5 The representations from PC Dunn indicated that although the need for routine searches form a condition of the licence, the CCTV footage (which will be viewed on June 17<sup>th</sup>) suggests that the perpetrators on the night were known to the doorstaff, with fist-bumps exchanged as the perpetrators arrived. This was to be contrasted to those seeking admission who followed, who appeared to be properly searched. The record will reflect that Mrs. Cochrane, for the premises licence holder, indicated that her recollection of the CCTV footage she had seen does not accord with the police representation.
- 5.6 The constabulary's representations conclude by saving that it now has no confidence in the ability of the collective management of the premises to promote the licensing objectives and that the incident on 19 May 2019 justifies the summary review of the premises licence today. The premises licence holder had proposed some conditions, which were discussed. They say that having agreed modifications to the premises licence in 2018 aimed at allaying concerns at the time, they have no confidence that further modifications now would be appropriate. Those earlier modifications included a change in the Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS) at the time, whose management of the premises had come under scrutiny. That it was the same person removed last year who appeared to be in charge on the night in question raises significant concerns about the judgment of the premises licence holder. This also challenges the merit in removal of the current DPS as an appropriate interim step today. Nor is it immediately apparent to the sub-committee that exclusion of



licensable activities would avert the sort of situation that unfolded on the night in question.

- 5.7 The sub-committee finds that based on the representations made by Derbyshire Constabulary today, there has been a failure to promote the licensing objectives. This is due to the premises being concerned in serious crime and serious disorder and also due to a lack of effective control over the management of the premises.
- The Sub-Committee has **RESOLVED** to take the following interim step 6. pending the hearing of a full review:
- 6.1 Suspend the Premises Licence for D'Gios, 17 Victoria Street, Derby DE1 1ES. This interim step will remain in force until the full review is determined or until an appeal is disposed of resulting from the full review determination, whichever is later.
- 7. The reasons for this decision are as follows:
- 7.1 Having taken into account the 4 licensing objectives, the guidance issued under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003, the Council's licensing policy and the Human Rights Act, the Sub-Committee was satisfied that one or more of the licensing objectives have been, and in the future will be, undermined without this interim step being taken.
- The date set for a full review of the Premises Licence, which shall take 8. place at Derby City Council, The Council House, Corporation Street, Derby, DE1 2FS, is Monday, 17 June 2019 at 10.00am.

We act on behalf of Ei Group Plc. Our client is the freeholder owner of these premises and has received a copy of the decision notice following the expedited review on 23<sup>rd</sup> May 2019.

We would be grateful if you would accept this letter as a formal representation to the review on behalf of our client.

Ei Group Plc owns around 4000 public houses in England and Wales. Around 90% of these premises are the subject of lease/tenancy agreements by which the tenant operates his/her/its own business out of our client's premises. The lease/tenancy agreement makes it clear that all operational responsibility for the premises lies with the tenant. D'Gios is the subject of a 30 year lease agreement which expires in 2031. Our client's tenant is Mr P Meah and Mrs S Meah.

Our client has serious concerns about the operation of these premises under the current management. Following receipt of the decision notice, our client's regional manager met with its tenants with a view to arranging a surrender of the lease. In the event that the lease is surrendered, when our client recovers possession of the premises, the premises licence will be transferred to our client.

It is clear from the decision notice that the causes of the concerns that led to the review was ineffective management of the premises. Our client is attempting to remove that management from the premises and if it is able to do so and transfer the licence to itself by the time of the review hearing, it is hoped that no further action will be necessary.

In the event that our client is unable to recover possession of the premises before the review hearing, we submit that the licensing objectives could be promoted by the removal of the current DPS and a suspension of the premises licence whilst the current tenants remain in occupation.



We expect, however that our client will recover possession of these premise and the premises licence will be transferred to our client prior to the review hearing on 17<sup>th</sup> June. In those circumstances Ei Group Plc will be the premises licence holder and will appear before the Licensing Committee to deal with the review.



#### **ANNEX 1 - MANDATORY CONDITIONS**

#### **MANDATORY CONDITIONS - SUPPLY OF ALCOHOL**

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence
  - a. at any time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence; or
  - b. at any time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- 2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

#### **MANDATORY CONDITIONS - DOOR SUPERVISION**

3. Each individual required to be at the premises to carry out a security activity must be licensed by the Security Industries Authority.

#### **MANDATORY CONDITION IMPLEMENTED ON 28 MAY 2014.**

- 1. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- 2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1 —

- (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
- (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula P = D + (DxV)Where P = D + (DxV)
- (ii) D is the rate of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence—
- (i) the holder of the premises licence,
- (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
- (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence:
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "valued added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994
- 3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 4. (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
- (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

#### **MANDATORY CONDITIONS IMPLEMENTED 1 OCTOBER 2014**

1. (1). The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises."

(2) An irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of

alcohol for consumption on the premises -

- (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to –
- (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
- (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
- (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective.
- (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective.;

- (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- 2. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 3. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- (2) The Designated Premises Supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy
- (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either
- (a) holographic mark or
- (b) an ultraviolet feature
- 4. The responsible person must ensure that –
- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following

(i) beer or cider: ½ pint;

(ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and

(iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and

(c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

- 1 No film shall be exhibited unless:
  - a. it has received a "U", "PG", "12A", "15", or "18" certificate of the British Board of Film Classification: or
  - b. it is a current newsreel, which has not been submitted to the British Board of Film Classification.

No person apparently under the age of eighteen years shall be admitted to any exhibition at which there is to be shown any film which has received an "18" certificate from the British Board of Film Classification.

3 "15" Films

No person apparently under the age of fifteen years shall be admitted to any exhibition at which there is to be shown any film which has received an "15" certificate from the British Board of Film Classification.

4 "12A" Films

No person apparently under the age of twelve years shall be admitted to any exhibition unless accompanied by an adult at which there is to be shown any film, which has received a "12A" certificate from the British Board of Film Classification.

5 "PG" Films

Some scenes contained at which there is to be shown any film, which has received a "PG" certificate from the British Board of Film Classification, may be unsuitable for young children.

- 9) The DPS shall ensure that a written incident log is maintained within the premises and details of all relevant incidents are recorded within the log. This log shall be kept on the premises for a period of not less than 12 months and be made available upon request by a Police Officer or an authorised officer as detailed within Section 13 of the Licensing Act 2003.
- 10) The premises will have and adopt a drugs policy. All staff working at the premises will be made aware of what this policy entails and any systems or procedures they are expected to follow.
