



78 points across the EYFSP with at least 6 in each of the scales in PSE and CLL


This measure defines children achieving 78 points or more across the scales and at least 6 in each of the scales associated with the Personal, Social and Emotional (PSE) and Communication, Language and Literacy (CLL) areas of learning.






narrowing the gap between the lowest achieving 20% in the EYFSP

The percentage gap in achievement between the lowest 20 per cent of achieving children in a local authority (mean score), and the score of the median child in the same authority expressed as a percentage of the same median score.






Key Stage 1 reading: level 2B+






Key Stage 1 writing: level 2B+






Key Stage 1 mathematics: level 2B+





Key Stage 2 English and mathematics: level 4+








Key Stage 2 English and mathematics: level 4+

FSM gap has narrowed for reading and maths at L2B+


KS2
