The Board wished her well on this role. Objections have been sent by Councillors, Neighbourhood Manager and residents regarding this development.</p> <p>Street sign Ellesmere Avenue-Investigations have been carried out by Derby Homes to look at the possibility of changing the numbers on the blocks due to residents from Ellesmere Avenue receiving mail, debt collectors and paramedics knocking at their doors. 	<p>sent on 02.02.09 to residents living in the blocks to ensure that their full address is always used.</p> <p>Parking around schools-A campaign with Parking Services &amp; Fire Services is due to take place within the next couple of weeks.</p> <p>Alvaston Bowling Green-The green has recently experienced damage. As a result Crime Prevention team have visited and provided short term recommendations and help to reduce future vandalism.</p>
