Derby Poverty Commission

Purpose

 - Examine the causes of poverty
 - Make recommendations and proposals for alleviating poverty.
- 4.3 The Commission's high-level third year strategic objectives are:
 - Establishing a sustainable funding strategy
 - Completion of the current Poverty Truth Commission
 - Establishment of Focus Groups (Funding; Equality, Diversity, & Inclusion; Essentials; Child Poverty)
 - Enhance Communication Strategies
 - Focus on Equality, Diversity, & Inclusion in Commission Membership and Community Engagement.
