**25/14 Request for Sunday trading at Simply Pleasure, 132  
London Road, Derby, DE1 2SR**

The Sub-Committee considered a request for Sunday trading at Simply Pleasure, 132 London Road, Derby, DE1 2SR.

The Sub-Committee heard evidence from: Sandra Mansell (Licensing) and Megan Lock and took into account the written documentation received.

**Decision**

In making its decision, the Sub-Committee had regard to the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1982, the Sex Establishment Regulations, the standard conditions for Sex Establishment Licences and Human Rights Act 1998 and carefully considered all the evidence presented to it.

The Sub-Committee made this decision to promote the standard Sex Establishment Regulations.

**Resolved to grant the request for Sunday trading at Simply Pleasure, 132 London Road, Derby, DE1 2SR on 14 and 21 December with the following conditions attached;**

The Premises shall not be open to the public before 10:00 hours and will not remain open to the public after 16:00 hours on any given Sunday.

No flyer, advertisement or any other matter which advertises the additional opening hours on Sundays shall contain any image or content of a sexual or adult nature and shall state that no person under the age of 18 shall be admitted to the premises.

## **REASONS**

The reasons for this decision were as follows:

Having taken into account the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1982, the Sex Establishment Regulations, the standard conditions for Sex Establishment Licences and the Human Rights Act, the Sub-Committee sought to balance the interests of the applicant against the standard conditions regarding Sunday trading, as had previously been adopted by Derby City Council.

The Sub-Committee felt it was reasonable and proportionate to allow the request for Sunday trading subject to the conditions specified.

All parties were advised of their right to appeal the decision and directed towards the guidance attached to the decision notice.
