Promoting Equality and Human Rights

- Derby Racial Equality Council in partnership with Derbyshire Friend, Disability Direct, Derby Women's Centre and Forum of Faiths Derby have come together to establish Derbyshire Equality and Human Rights Partnership.
- DEHRP aims to inform, facilitate and deliver cohesive and partnership approach to addressing equality and human rights in Derby and Derbyshire.
- DEHRP aims to be consultative body in Derbyshire to enable statutory, voluntary and private sector organisations to be supported around equality and human rights legislation and developing good practice.

Objectives of DEHRP

- The partnership will support and approve local equality and human rights strategies and specific action plans.
- Review and monitor the progress on the Equality
 Schemes, impact assessments and implementation action plans.
- Identify equality and human rights priorities and make recommendations on actions
- Support any existing equality and diversity sub-groups and networks to prioritise equalities and human rights issues.
- To develop a pool of consultants to provide training and consultancy services.
- To develop partnership agreements and memorandum of understanding with key organisations and bodies to support and help identify barriers and develop actions plans on Equality and Human Rights

Work of DEHRP

- To ensure the implementation of the all Equality and Human Rights Legislation
- To provide a Strategic Leadership and focus in Derby and Derbyshire on equality and human rights by working in partnership and developing, implementing and promoting strategies, policies and good practice.
- Maintain a programme of public information and public education to promote equality and human rights.
- Provides information, advice and support to individuals to pursue justice through equality and human rights legislation.
- Provide support and information to communities to ensure equality of opportunity and effective participation and engagement.

Future Action plan and Priority Areas

- Launch of Derbyshire Equality and Human Rights Partnership
- Increase membership of DEHRP
- To identify funding for infrastructure and capacity building for DEHRP
- DEHRP to develop strong partnerships across
 Derbyshire to work in collaboration on Equality and human rights
- Develop memorandum of understanding and partnership agreements with Equality and Human Rights Commission, Statutory, Voluntary and Private Sector
- Equality and Human Rights Training and Consultancy Services

Partnership work with Minority Communities Diversity Forum

- Prioritise joint work that can be written into work programme
- Training for MCDF members on Equality and Human Rights to become local champions
- Develop partnership with Local Strategic Partnership to inform Local Area Agreements
- Equality and Human Rights Audits and impact assessments
