1.1 To consider and comment on the Review of Access to Healthcare Services for People with Learning Disability conducted by the Derbyshire County Council's Adult Health and Care Improvement and Scrutiny Committee.

SUPPORTING INFORMATION

- 2.1 In January 2009 ASH Commission received a presentation from Jackie Fleeman of Derbyshire County PCT on the Healthcare of Adults with Learning Disabilities. Ms Fleeman informed the Commission that nationally people with learning difficulties have worse health than the general population and that an independent inquiry into access to healthcare for people with learning disabilities had been set up by the Secretary of Sate to focus on the action needed.
- 2.2 Members were also informed that Derbyshire County Council's OSC was due to conduct a review which would be looking into the experience of people with learning disabilities using healthcare services.
- 2.3 Members had requested that the once this review had been completed a report of the findings be presented to the Commission. The final report of the review is attached.
